"One may be misled by the King James Version notes at the end of every letter. These little postscripts are called 'subscriptions' from the fact that copyists wrote them underneath or after the letters. But the sentence notes appear very late — their earliest form is fourth century, so they are merely scribes' opinions."

#### 2. Epistolary Thanksgiving

- <sup>2</sup> We give thanks to God always for you all, making mention of you in our prayers;
- <sup>3</sup> Remembering without ceasing your work of faith, and labour of love, and patience of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ, in the sight of God and our Father; (1 Thess. 1:2–3, actually goes until 1:10)

#### 3. Body of Letter

#### 4. Conclusion/Valediction

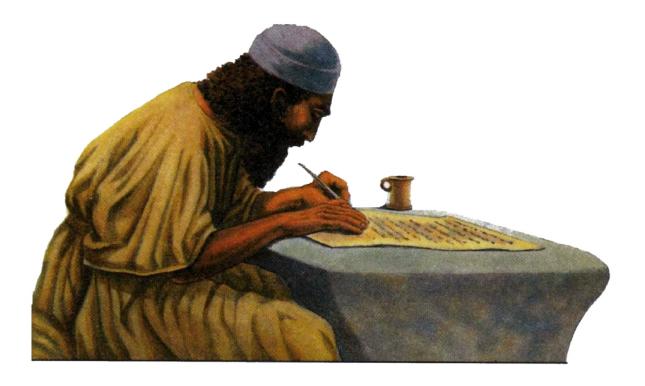

\*Paul did <u>not</u> physically write his own epistles (although, as an educated man, he was certainly <u>able</u> to do so).

\*Paul dictated to scribes who then wrote down the epistles



## Do we have all the letters Paul wrote?

<sup>9</sup> *I wrote unto you in an epistle* not to company with fornicators: <sup>10</sup> Yet not altogether with the fornicators of this world, or with the covetous, or extortioners, or with idolaters; for then must ye needs go out of the world.

(1 Corinthians **5:9–10**)

■ ¹ *This is the third time I am coming to you*. In the mouth of two or three witnesses shall every word be established.

(2 Corinthians 13:1)

■ <sup>3</sup> How that by revelation he made known unto me the mystery; (as I wrote afore in few words, <sup>4</sup> Whereby, when ye read, ye may understand my knowledge in the mystery of Christ)

## Reading Someone else's Mail

- We are only reading one side of an ancient conversation, there is much implicit information about which we have to guess.
  Therefore, the message contained in the letters can sometimes be difficult to determine and hard to understand.
- The letters were written in response to a specific situation, at times they may be more *timely than timeless* 
  - Now concerning the things *whereof ye wrote unto me*: It is good for a man not to touch a woman. (1 Corinthians 7:1)
- Paul's letters are not a repository of all early Christian doctrine: they are situational.

## Paul and Thessalonians

- Paul spent "thee sabbaths" in "Second" Missionary Journey of AD 49–52 (Acts 17:1–10)
- A few Jews, "devout" men (God-fearers), and prominent women are among the converts mentioned by Acts 17:4
- Paul and Silas fled to Berea before the church could be established further



- Likely that 1 Thessalonians is the earliest extant Christian writing (c. A.D. 49/50)
- Paul wrote to the church in Thessalonica while headquartered at Corinth
  - "After these things Paul departed from Athens, and came to Corinth... And when Silas and Timotheus were come from Macedonia, Paul...testified to the Jews that Jesus was Christ." (Acts 18:1,5)
- Occasion of the Letter: Timothy came to Paul in Corinth and reported Thessalonian concerns
  - Paul had not returned
  - Members had died
  - Jesus Christ had not returned

- "Paul, and Silvanus, and Timotheus, unto the church of the Thessalonians which is in God the Father and in the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace be unto you, and peace, from God our Father, and the Lord Jesus Christ."

## Issues Addressed in 1 Thessalonians 2

But even after that we had suffered before, and were shamefully entreated, as ye know, at Philippi, we were bold in our God to speak unto you the gospel of God with much contention.

1 Thessalonians 2:2

Acts 16:6 – Paul and Silas beaten, incarcerated, then driven out of town



Nor of men sought we glory, neither of you, nor yet of others, when we might have been burdensome, as the apostles of Christ. <sup>7</sup> But we were gentle among you, even as a nurse cherisheth her children: <sup>8</sup> So being affectionately desirous of you, we were willing to have imparted unto you, not the gospel of God only, but also our own souls, because ye were dear unto us. <sup>9</sup> For ye remember, brethren, our labour and travail: for labouring night and day, because we would not be chargeable unto any of you, we preached unto you the gospel of God. <sup>10</sup> Ye are witnesses, and God also, how holily and justly and unblameably we behaved ourselves among you that believe:

- \*"Burdensome" = demand support (food & money)
- \* We preached while laboring

- <sup>1</sup> Wherefore when we could no longer forbear, we thought it good to be left at Athens alone;
- <sup>2</sup> And sent Timotheus, our brother, and minister of God, and our fellowlabourer in the gospel of Christ, to establish you, and to comfort you concerning your faith:
- <sup>3</sup> That no man should be moved by these afflictions: for yourselves know that we are appointed thereunto.
- <sup>4</sup> For verily, when we were with you, we told you before that we should suffer tribulation; even as it came to pass, and ye know.
- <sup>5</sup> For this cause, when I could no longer forbear, I sent to know your faith, lest by some means the tempter have tempted you, and our labour be in vain.

# 1 Thessalonians 4 & Paul's Exhortations

#### Paul's exhortations

- Abstain from fornication πορνεία (v. 3)
  - (v. 5) "not in the lust of concupiscence" (KJV)
  - (v. 5) "not with lustful passion" (NRS)
- Do not defraud ("take advantage of") your brother (v. 6)
- Be holy (v. 7)
- Love one another (v. 9)
  - But as touching brotherly love (φιλαδελφία) ye need not that I write unto you: for ye yourselves are taught of God to love one another. <sup>10</sup> And indeed ye do it toward all the brethren which are in all Macedonia: but we beseech you, brethren, that ye increase more and more; <sup>11</sup> And that ye study to be quiet, and to do your own business, and to work with your own hands, as we commanded you;

## Those with no Hope

1 Thessalonians 1:13–14

13 But I would not have you to be ignorant, brethren, concerning them which are asleep, that ye sorrow not, even as others which have no hope. <sup>14</sup> For if we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so them also which sleep in Jesus will God bring with him.

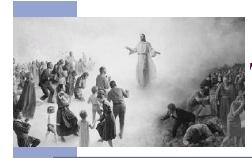

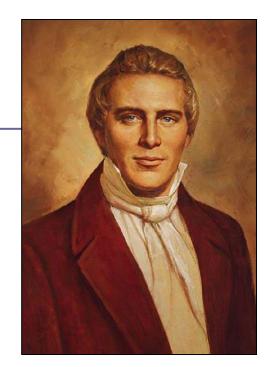

## Second Coming

## **D&C** 137

#### **January 21, 1836**

- 1 The heavens were opened upon us, and <u>I beheld the celestial kingdom of God</u>, and the glory thereof, <u>whether in the body or out I cannot tell</u>.
- 2 I saw the transcendent beauty of the gate through which the heirs of that kingdom will enter, which was like unto circling flames of fire;
- 3 Also the blazing throne of God, whereon was seated the Father and the Son.
- 4 I saw the beautiful streets of that kingdom, which had the appearance of being paved with gold.
- 5 I saw Father <u>Adam</u> and <u>Abraham</u>; and my father and my mother; my brother <u>Alvin, that has</u> <u>long since slept</u>;

- 7 Thus came the voice of the Lord unto me, saying: All who have died without a knowledge of this gospel, who would have received it if they had been permitted to tarry, shall be heirs of the celestial kingdom of God;
- 8 Also all that shall die henceforth without a knowledge of it, who would have received it with all their hearts, shall be heirs of that kingdom;
- 9 For I, the Lord, will judge all men according to their works, according to the desire of their hearts.
- 10 And I also beheld that all children who die before they arrive at the years of accountability are saved in the celestial kingdom of heaven.

## Second Coming According to 1 Thessalonians 4–5

- For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God (4:16)
- the day of the Lord so cometh **as a thief in the night**. (5:2)
  - <sup>43</sup> But know this, that if the goodman of the house had known in what watch the **thief** would come, he would have watched, and would not have suffered his house to be broken up. <sup>44</sup> Therefore be ye also ready: **for in such an hour as ye think not the Son of man cometh.**

#### Matthew 24:43-44

■ But of that day and hour knoweth no man, no, not the angels of heaven, but my Father only.

#### **Matthew 24:36**

- For when they shall say, Peace and safety; then sudden destruction cometh upon them, (5:3)
- Therefore let us not sleep, as do others; but let us watch and be sober. (5:6)

#### **Latter Day Scripture and the Second Coming**

"Read the **24th chapter of Matthew**-particularly that inspired version as contained in the Pearl of Great Price. Then read the 45th section of the **Doctrine and Covenants** where the Lord, not man, has documented the signs of the times. Now turn to section 101 and section 133 of the Doctrine and **Covenants** and hear the step-by-step recounting of events leading up to the coming of the Savior. Finally, turn to the promises the Lord makes to those who keep the commandments when these judgments descend upon the wicked, as set forth in the **Doctrine and Covenants, section 38.**"

- v. 12–13 Respect and obey leaders
- v. 14 admonish unruly/idlers, fainthearted, and weak
- v. 15 do not "render evil for evil"
- v. 16 rejoice always; v. 17 pray without ceasing; v. 18 give thanks in all things
- **v. 19:** "Quench not the spirit"
  - "do not extinguish the spirit"
- **v. 20:** "Despise not prophesying"
  - "do not despise the prophecies" (προφητείας μὴ ἐξουθενεῖτε)
- v. 22: "Abstain from all appearance of evil."
  - "Abstain from every form of evil"(ἀπὸ παντὸς εἴδους πονηροῦ ἀπέχεσθε)

## 2 Thessalonians

- <u>Date</u>: A.D. 51/52, shortly after 1 Thessalonians
- Purpose of 2 Thessalonians
  - To let the saints know that the Second Coming was not going to happen as soon as some thought
    - Paul is correcting excessive enthusiasm caused by his first letter
  - For this we say unto you by the word of the Lord, that we which are alive and remain unto the coming of the Lord shall not prevent them which are asleep.

1 Thess. 4:15

■ Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord.

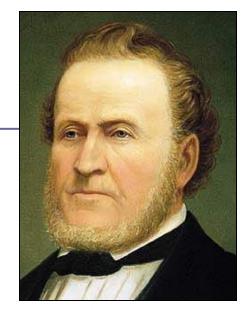

# Galatia

This included several Greek cities and Roman colonies, including ones visited by Paul and Barnabas in the "First" Missionary Journey of AD 46–48 (Acts 13 – 14)



Paul *may* have evangelized the northern area of ethnic Galatia en route to Troas during the "Second" Missionary Journey of AD 49–53

Acts 18:23 reports that Paul "went over all the country of Galatia and Phrygia in order" in the "Third" Missionary Journey of AD 53–58

# When was the Letter(s) written?

Between A.D. 48–60, although mid–50's the most probable time

Similarities in themes and structure to 2 Corinthians and Romans perhaps support mid-50's date



# Authorship?

Paul, an apostle, (not of men, neither by man, but by Jesus Christ, and God the Father, who raised him from the dead;) Galatians 1:1

# Why did Paul write the letter?

1. Galatian church had come under the influence of missionaries preaching "another gospel"

2. "Judaizers," Jewish Christians insisting upon observance of Mosaic Law

3. Paul and his credentials have been questioned

## The Crux of the letter

- <sup>6</sup> I marvel that <u>ye are so soon removed</u> from him that called you into the grace of Christ <u>unto another gospel</u>:
- <sup>7</sup> Which is not another; but there be some that trouble you, <u>and would</u> <u>pervert the gospel of Christ.</u>
- <sup>8</sup> But though we, or an angel from heaven, preach any other gospel unto you than that which we have preached unto you, let him be accursed.
- <sup>9</sup> As we said before, so say I now again, If any *man* preach any other gospel unto you than that ye have received, let him be accursed.

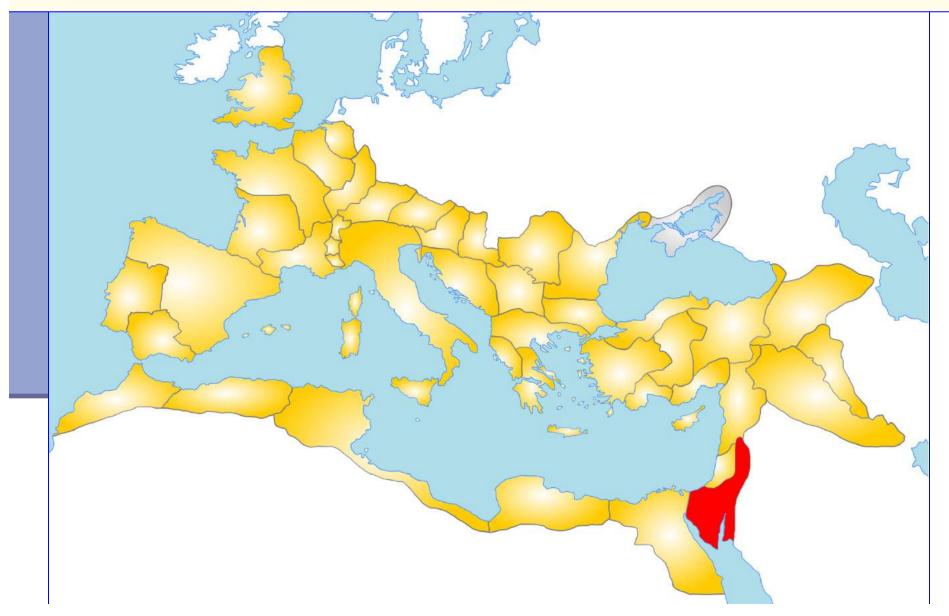

"But neither Titus, who was with me, being a Greek, was compelled to be circumcised...But contrariwise, when they saw that the gospel of the uncircumcision was committed unto me, as the gospel of the circumcision was unto Peter...And when James, Cephas, and John, who seemed to be pillars, perceived the grace that was given unto me, they gave to me and Barnabas the right hands of fellowship; that we should go unto the heathen and they unto the circumcision. Only they would that we should remember the poor; the same which I also was forward to do." (Galatians 2:3,7–10)

### Paul's version of the Jerusalem Council

- 1) Gentiles converts do not need to be circumcised
- 2) Paul will lead the missionary effort to gentiles
- 3) Peter (Cephas) will lead the missionary effort to Jews
- 4) Paul should continue his efforts in the famine relief

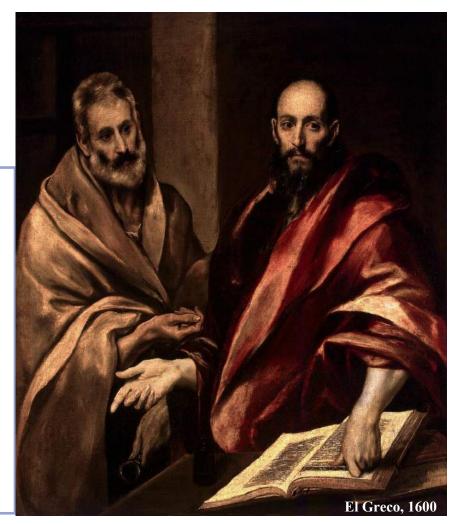
Main Point: \*PETER AND PAUL ARE IN PERFECT AGREEMENT ON THIS

# Paul chastises Peter for "dissimulation"

Galatians 2:11–14

11 But when *Peter was come to Antioch, I withstood him to the face, because he was to be blamed*. 12 For before that certain came from James, he did eat with the Gentiles: but when they were come, he withdrew and separated himself, fearing them which were of the circumcision. 13 And the other Jews dissembled likewise with him; insomuch that Barnabas also was carried away with their *dissimulation*. 14 But when I saw that they walked not uprightly according to the truth of the gospel, I said unto Peter before *them* all, If thou, being a Jew, livest after the manner of Gentiles, and not as do the Jews, why compellest thou the Gentiles to live as do the Jews?

**Galatians 2:11-14** 



\* "dissimulation" = hypocrisy

\*"Hypocrisy" because Peter knew it was ok to eat with Gentiles, but left anyway.

\*\*\*If you, a Jewish Christian, know it is ok to eat with Gentiles, why did you do something that will "compel" (or "encourage") Gentile Christians to become Jewish?



## In Peter's Defense:

- \*Peter is in a very difficult (no-win) situation; he is stuck between a rock and a hard place.
- \*Peter wants to keep the church together; to keep the church from falling apart. (Paul is not concerned if Jewish Christians get offended; James and Co. are not concerned if Gentile Christians get offended. But Peter, as the head of the church, is very concerned.)
- \*If Peter stays at dinner with Gentiles, he offends the Jewish Christians; if he leaves dinner, he offends the Gentile Christians.
- \*No matter what Peter did in that situation, he would have made people upset.

### What was the Basic Issue?

#### **Galatians 2:16–21**

- <sup>16</sup> Knowing that a man is not justified (δικαιοῦται) by the works of the law, but by the faith of Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Jesus Christ, that we might be justified by the faith of Christ (ἐκ πίστεως Χριστοῦ), and not by the works of the law: for by the works of the law shall no flesh be justified.
- <sup>17</sup> But if, while we seek to be justified by Christ, we ourselves also are found sinners, *is* therefore Christ the minister of sin? God forbid.
- <sup>18</sup> For if I build again the things which I destroyed, I make myself a transgressor.
- <sup>19</sup> For I through the law am dead to the law, that I might live unto God.
- <sup>20</sup> I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God (ἐν πίστει ζῶ τῆ τοῦ υἱοῦ τοῦ θεοῦ), who loved me, and gave himself for me.
- <sup>21</sup> I do not frustrate the grace of God: for if righteousness *come* by the law, then Christ is dead in vain.

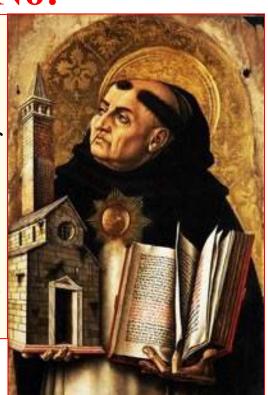

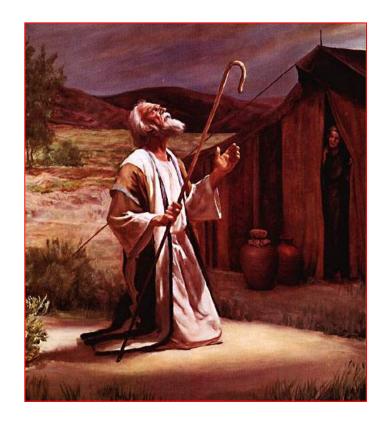

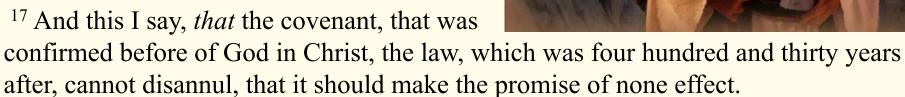

# Corinth at the Time of Paul

 Early saints converted by Paul during his second missionary journey, A.D. 50/51–52



- Historically prosperous Greek city because of its position on a strait joining central and southern Greece
  - Had been destroyed by the Romans in 146 BC and then refounded as a Roman colony in 44 BC
  - Was the capital of the Roman province of Achaea and the home of Greeks, Romans, Syrians, Jews, and many others

## Famous for its immoral atmosphere

- "And the temple of Aphrodite [at Corinth] was so rich that it owned more than a thousand temple slaves, courtesans, whom both men and women had dedicated to the goddess. And therefore it was also on account of these women that the city was crowded with people and grew rich; for instance, the ship captains freely squandered their money, and hence the proverb, 'Not for every man is the voyage to Corinth.'" (Strabo, Geography 8.6.20)
- The Church congregation seems to be mainly made up of Gentiles

# From Where was 1 Corinthians sent?

#### 1 Corinthians 16:8-9

- <sup>8</sup> But I will tarry at *Ephesus* until Pentecost.
- <sup>9</sup> For a great door and effectual is opened unto me, and *there are* many adversaries.





- 22 If any man love not the Lord Jesus Christ, let him be Anathema <sup>a</sup>Maran-atha.

## Who was Sosthenes?

He was the *ruler of the synagogue in Corinth* in *Acts 18:17* and seems to have been an opponent of Paul then—*apparently he later converted?*

- <sup>3</sup> Grace *be* unto you, and peace, from God our Father, and *from* the Lord Jesus Christ.

# Christ Crucified

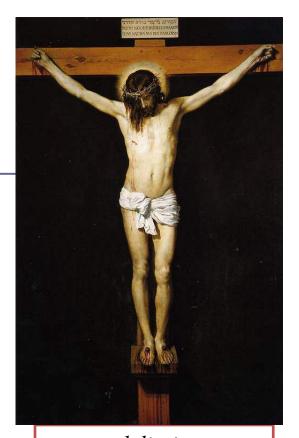

## ■ The Case of Incest (5:1–5)

- "It is widely reported that there is sexual immorality among you, immorality of a kind that is not found even among gentiles: that one of you is *living with his stepmother*." (5:1 NJB)
  - Lev. 18:8: "The nakedness of thy father's wife shalt thou not uncover: it *is* thy father's nakedness."
  - "As for adultery, Moses forbade it entirely, as esteeming it a happy thing that men should be wise in the affairs of wedlock; and that it was profitable both for cities and families that children should be known to be genuine. He also abhorred men's lying with their mothers, as one of the greatest crimes; and the like for lying with the father's wife, and with aunts, and sisters, and sons' wives, as all instances of abominable wickedness." (Josephus, Antiquities of the Jews 3.274)

(1 Corinthians 5:1)

## ■ What is Paul Saying Here?

- "[Though] absent in the body... I have judged already, as though I were present, concerning him that has so done this deed:
  ...Deliver such an one unto Satan... Put away from among yourselves that wicked person." (1 Cor. 5:3,5,13)
- "Deliver to Satan" = excommunicate
- vv. 6–8: a little leaven can leaven the whole lump
- v. 9: Reference to a previous letter where he instructed them not to "company with fornicators"

# "Dare any of you, having a matter against another, go to law before the unjust, and not before the saints?" 1 Corinthians 6:1

- Legal Cases: Lawsuits against Believers (6:1–8)
- Do ye not know that the saints shall judge the world? and if the world shall be judged by you, are ye unworthy to judge the smallest matters? (1 Corinthians 6:2)
- <sup>5</sup> I speak to your shame. Is it so, that there is not a wise man among you? no, not one that shall be able to judge between his brethren? (1 Corinthians 6:5)
- vv. 7–8: Sometimes people should suffer themselves to be wronged rather than sue (forgive & forget); others have sued wrongly
  - "And if any man will sue thee at the law, and take away thy coat, let him have thy cloke also." (Mat 5:40 KJV)
- vv.9–11 warnings to those acting badly
  - " Know ye not that the unrighteous shall not inherit the kingdom of God? Be not deceived: neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor effeminate (μαλακοί), nor abusers of themselves with mankind (ἀρσενοκοῖται), 10 Nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners, shall inherit the kingdom of God. 11 And such were some of you: but ye are washed, but ye are sanctified, but ye are justified in the name of the Lord Jesus, and by the Spirit of our God."

# 1 Corinthians 7 (–11) Understanding Paul's Time and Culture Specific Counsel

- Some of the most difficult to understand teachings in 1 Corinthians 7—such as his teaching on marriage and celibacy—can be better understood <u>and applied</u> by following these three steps:
- 1. Consider the occasional situation
  - Remember the cultural differences of this period
- **2.** Look for the lasting principles behind Paul's occasion-specific direction
  - Chastity, modesty, and other eternal principles apply in both Paul's time and ours
- **3.** Only then try to apply the principle (not necessarily the practice) to our time and occasion
  - For this use the spirit and the teaching of modern apostles and prophets
- \*\*4. At times Paul makes it clear that he is only giving opinion not commandments of the Lord
- But I speak this *by permission*, and *not of commandment*. (1 Cor. 7:6)
- But to the rest *speak I*, *not the Lord*: (1 Cor. 7:12)
- Now concerning virgins *I have no commandment of the Lord*: yet *I give my judgment*, (1 Cor. 7:25)

# General Principles of Marital Intimacy (7:1–7)

Problems of Marriage and Celibacy (7:1–40)

Topic raised by an earlier Corinthian question: "Now concerning the things whereof ye wrote unto me:

'It is good for a man not to touch a woman." (7:1)

- Confirmed by the JST: "Now concerning the things whereof ye wrote unto me, saying: 'It is good for a man not to touch a woman."
- "The husband should give to his wife her conjugal rights, and likewise the wife to her husband." (7:3 NRSV)
  - KJV's "due benevolence" also rendered "marital duty" [NIV] and "what she has the right to expect" [NJB]
  - Paul instead taught that physical intimacy was not only appropriate but expected in marriage
- "For the wife does not have authority over her own body, but the husband does; likewise the husband does not have authority over his own body, but the wife does." (7:4 NRSV)
  - Sexual relations are between a husband and wife only; one does not have the right to engage in sexual activity with others

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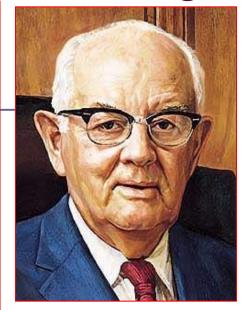
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# Modern Council on Intimacy in Marriage

President Kimball has explained:

"It is the destiny of men and women to join together to make eternal family units. In the context of lawful marriage, the intimacy of sexual relations is right and divinely approved. There is nothing unholy or degrading about sexuality in itself [between a husband and his wife], for by that means men and women join in a process of creation and in an expression of love."

## Advice to Specific Groups (7:8–16)

Problems of Marriage and Celibacy (7:1-40)

#### To the **Unmarried and the Widowed**: Better to Marry than to Burn!

- "I say therefore to the unmarried and widows, It is good for them if they abide even as I. But if they cannot contain, let them marry: *for it is better to marry than to burn*" (7:8–9; note the JST "than that any should commit sin")
- At this point, Paul does <u>not</u> seem to be married. He compares himself to the unmarried [widowers] and widows.
- Was Paul Married at this point? Was he ever married?
  - No direct evidence that Paul was ever married and no direct evidence that he was never married
  - In absence of direct evidence, I assume the norm for society
  - As a good Jewish Pharisee, Paul would <u>probably</u> have been married
    - Acts 26:10 Which thing I also did in Jerusalem: and many of the saints did I shut up in prison, having received authority from the chief priests; and when they were put to death, *I gave my voice against them*. (NRSV *I also cast my vote against them*)
  - Paul certainly seems to know a lot about marital intimacy
  - In light of 1 Cor. 7:8 it may be wondered if Paul was a widower?

## Advice to Specific Groups (7:8–16)

Problems of Marriage and Celibacy (7:1–40)

#### To the Married: Regarding Divorce and Separation

- "And unto the married I command, yet not I, but the Lord, Let not the wife depart from her husband: But and if she depart, let her remain unmarried, or be reconciled to her husband: and let not the husband put away his wife." (7:10–11)
  - "But I say unto you, That whosoever shall put away his wife, saving for the cause of fornication, causeth her to commit adultery: and whosoever shall marry her that is divorced committeth adultery." (Matthew 5:32; 19:9)
- "But to the rest speak I, not the Lord: If any brother hath a wife that believeth not, and she be pleased to dwell with him, let him not put her away . . . For the unbelieving husband is sanctified by the wife . . ." (7:12–14)
- **But if the unbelieving depart, let him depart.** A brother or a sister is not under bondage in such *cases*: but God hath called us to peace. For what knowest thou, O wife, whether thou shalt save *thy* husband? or how knowest thou, O man, whether thou shalt save *thy* wife? " (7:15–16)
  - It might be possible to propose a scenario where Paul himself might have been separated—if his wife was the daughter of stringent Pharisees, perhaps she did not believe or perhaps they insisted upon a separation, and Paul, not willing to divorce her, had not remarried

## Advice to Specific Groups (7:25–35)

Problems of Marriage and Celibacy (7:1–40)

#### **To The Unmarried: Reasons for Avoiding Marriage in View of the Impending Crisis**

"Now concerning virgins, I have no command of the Lord, but I give my opinion as one who by the Lord's mercy is trustworthy. I think that, in view of the impending crisis, it is well for you to remain as you are."

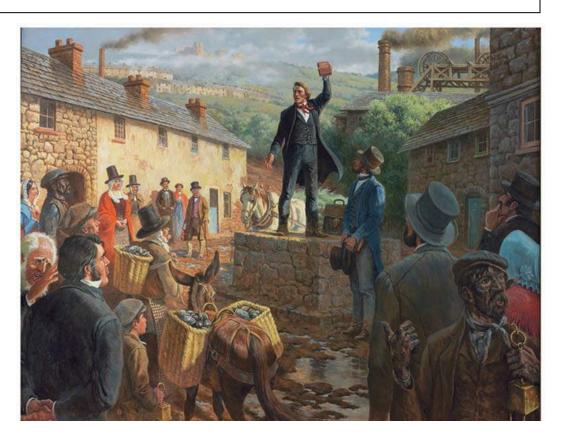

- The "present distress" could be present or impending persecution; feared or imminent trouble; or the tribulations expected with the Parousia
  - V. 29. "But this I say, brethren, the time is short."
- "Art thou bound unto a wife? seek not to be loosed. Art thou loosed from a wife? seek not a wife. But and if thou marry, thou hast not sinned; and if a virgin marry, she hath not sinned. Nevertheless such shall have trouble in the flesh: but I spare you." (7:27–28)
- "Celibacy" as a function of service or necessary state during a particular call
  - "But I speak unto you who are called unto the ministry. For this I say, brethren, the time that remains is but short, that ye shall be sent forth unto the ministry. Even they who have wives, shall be as though they had none: for ye are called and chosen to do the Lord's work." (7:29 JST)

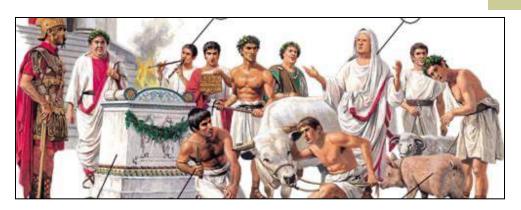

- \*Often non-Christians would slaughter an animal at local pagan temple and offer it up to various deities (gods get bones/fat; people get the meat).
- \*People would invite friends and have feast at pagan temple.
- \*Issues for Christians:
  - --Is meat sacrificed to idols contaminated in some way?
  - --By partaking of such meat is one committing idolatry?

#### Background

- \*In 1<sup>st</sup> century A.D. culturally conservative standards of modesty were different than today.
- \*In conservative society, sight of a woman's hair on her head was considered immodest.
- \*In conservative society, it was husband's exclusive prerogative to see his wife's hair uncovered.
  - \*Don't take offense at Paul's cultural standards of modesty. Seek to understand the context, and then apply what general principles you can. (Not everything will be directly applicable!)
  - \*Because of his culture, Paul had some attitudes toward women that we don't share in our culture.

"her head" =
1) Her actual head,
2) Her leader/steward (husband)

#### \*WHY? Because it was immodest

(Pagan priestesses sometimes shaved their heads, women charged with adultery were forced to shave their heads; prostitutes would sometimes entice customers through the sight of their hair.)



\*Conclusion: Paul simply wants women to adhere to the culturally conservative standard of modesty (similar to what we do today).

\*In Greek, no separate word for "husband" / "wife." Thus, "man" may mean "husband"; "woman" may mean "wife," depending upon the context

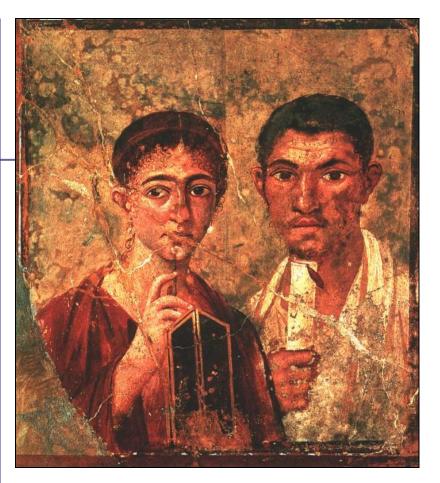
\*The term "head" can either mean "noggin" or "leader/steward"

\*Paul was in a male dominated, male chauvinistic society

\*Don't be offended at Paul's male dominated culture. Seek to understand what Paul was trying to teach, and then apply what general principles you can

\*Not everything Paul said will be applicable for our society today

\*When speaking of men and women,
Paul was focusing on roles and
stewardships, rather than simply gender.

\*Not an issue of gender, or status/priority in God's eyes.

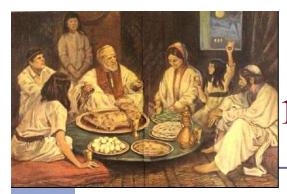

# Fellowship Meal 1 Cor. 11:20–22, 33–34



- \*Jesus ate the Last Supper and then administered the sacrament to his apostles.
- \*Many early Christians met together to eat a fellowship meal (called an <u>agape/love feast</u>), and <u>then</u> to partake of the sacrament of the Lord's Supper in conjunction with the fellowship meal.
- \*The fellowship meal would be a potluck dinner, with members bringing and sharing what food they could.
- What are the problems that arise out of this feast? (hint: vv. 20–22)

#### This Do

1 Cor. 11:23-25

- \* "testament" = covenant
- \*Earliest ref. to sacrament (earlier than Gospels) = It was <u>symbolic</u> ("in remembrance"), not literal ("transubstantiation").
- \* <u>Only</u> ref. to sacrament in Paul's letters. If Paul didn't mention it here, we wouldn't know he <u>knew</u> about it.
- \*Conclusion: Paul's letters don't tell us all he knew. Paul knew much more than he tells us in his letters.





### The Diversity of Spiritual Gifts

1 Cor. 12:4-7

Now concerning spiritual *gifts* (τῶν πνευματικῶν), brethren, I would not have you ignorant. (1Corinthians 12:1)

\*<u>Differences of administrations</u> = different ways of administering or serving

(i.e. each person has different strengths and serves in different ways)

\*<u>Diversities of operations</u> = differences in activities



"To some it is given by the Holy Ghost to know the <u>differences of administration</u>, as it will be pleasing unto the same Lord, according as the Lord will, <u>suiting his mercies according to the conditions of the children of men</u>. 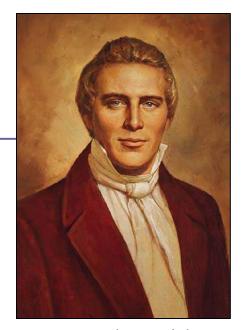

- In the KJV the word "charity" is from the Greek *agapē* 
  - Most of the time it is rendered as "Love" when it is used in the KJV (e.g. Matt. 24:12; Luke 11:42; John 5:42; 13:35; 15:9–10, 13; 17:26)
- In Greek different words for Love: *filos* (friendly love, beloved), *eros* (erotic), *storgē* (affection)
- "But <u>charity</u> is the <u>pure love of Christ</u>, and it endureth forever; and whoso is found possessed of it at the last day, it shall be well with him.

■ How is **Charity** defined in 1 Corinthians 13?

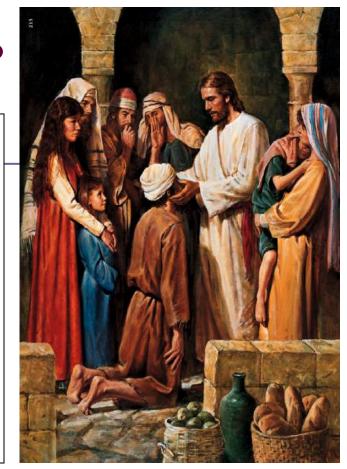

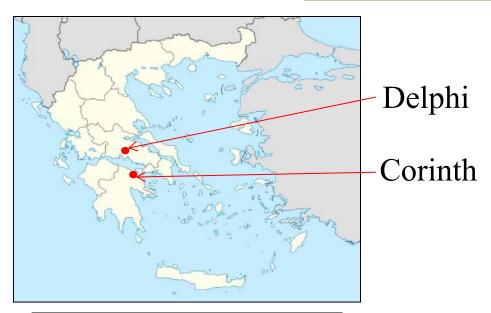

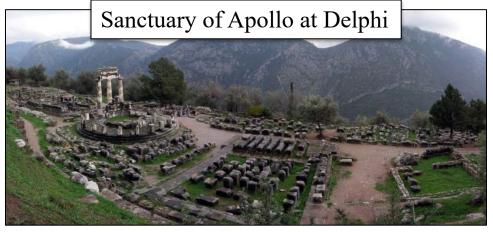

## 1 Corinthians 14

#### **Background:**

\*The Gift of Tongues has different manifestations:

- 1) to speak in known languages (Acts 2);
- 2) to speak in unknown languages (1 Cor. 14).

\*Early Christians sometimes were inspired by the Spirit to speak in "unknown tongues" or JST "another tongue" (i.e. in a language no one understood)

\*Issue for Christians:

Is speaking in tongues a <u>means</u> to an end?

Or is speaking in tongues an <u>en</u>d in and of itself?

#### 1 Corinthians 14:5–6

\*The gift of tongues should be a <u>means</u> to an end, and <u>not</u> an <u>end</u> in and of itself (i.e. not just to impress people).

\*The end should be <u>edification</u> through <u>divine communication</u> (i.e. revelation, knowledge, prophecy, doctrine, etc.)

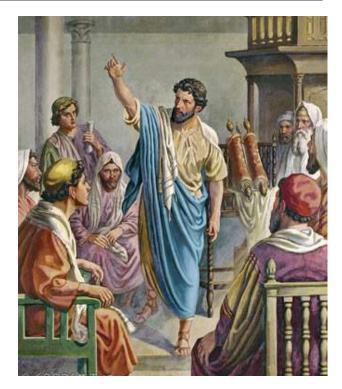

## Early Church Fathers on 1 Corinthians 15:29

Now if some of them are "baptized for the dead," can we not assume that they have a reason for it? Certainly he [Paul] is maintaining that they practiced this in the belief that the ordinance would be a vicarious baptism and as such be advantageous to the flesh of others, which they assumed would be resurrected, for unless this referred to a physical resurrection there would be no point in carrying out a physical baptism

Tertullian, *De Resurrectione* 48 (c. A.D. 160–230)

I don't believe that the apostle was giving his approval to the practice, but rather signifying that those who practiced it thereby indicated their belief in a physical resurrection, being foolishly baptized for the dead. . . . For elsewhere he speaks of only one baptism. Therefore to baptize "for the dead" means to baptize for bodies; for the body, as we have demonstrated, is really dead.

Tertullian, Adversus Marcionem, 5.10

## Early Church Fathers on 1 Corinthians 15:29

From Asia to Gaul has reached us the account of a certain practice, namely that when any die without baptism among them, they baptize others in their place and in their name, so that, rising in the resurrection, they will not have to pay the penalty of having failed to receive baptism, but rather become subject to the authority of the creator of the world. For this reason this tradition which has reached us is said to be the very thing to which the apostle himself refers when he says, "If the dead rise not at all, what shall they do who are baptized for the dead?"

Epiphanius, Against Heresies 1.28.6 (c. A.D. 310–400)



## The Resurrected Body (15:35–58)



"But some *man* will say, How are the dead raised up? and with what body do they come?" (15:35)

- "All flesh is not the same flesh . . ." (15:39)
- Two concepts
  - Earthly and heavenly bodies differ
    - "There are both heavenly bodies (*epourania*, celestial) and earthly bodies (*epigeia*, terrestrial), but the glory of the heavenly is one thing, and that of the earthly is another." (15:40 NRSV)
    - "There are also celestial bodies, and bodies terrestrial, <u>and bodies telestial</u>; but the glory of the celestial is one, and the terrestrial, another; <u>and the telestial</u>, <u>another</u>." (JST 1 Cor. 15:40)
  - Paul is simply contrasting terrestrial/earthly/mortal bodies with celestial/heavenly/resurrected bodies.

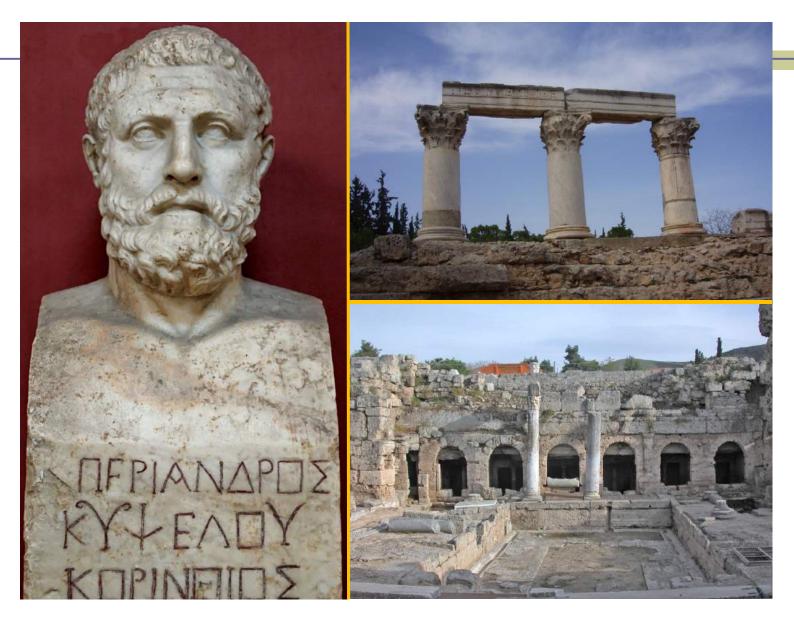

A junior companion of Paul; transmitted other letters of Paul (Thessalonians, 1 Corinthians)

# Why was 2 Corinthians written?

- 1. To express joy in those who, due to his former letters, had repented and humbled themselves before the Lord and were now ready to abide under God's constituted leaders. (1:12–7:16)
- 2. To fully organize the welfare contribution for the unfortunate Saints living elsewhere. (8:1–9:15)
- 3. To warn those who yet continued in rebellion against authority and to expose their hypocrisy to the branch. (10:1–13:10)

#### 2 Corinthians 1:1-11

#### **Epistolary Introduction**

<sup>1</sup> Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ by the will of God, and Timothy *our* brother, unto the church of God which is at Corinth, with all the saints which are in all Achaia: <sup>2</sup> Grace *be* to you and peace from God our Father, and *from* the Lord Jesus Christ.

#### Epistolary Thanksgiving

<sup>3</sup> Blessed *be* God, even the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies, and the God of all comfort; <sup>4</sup> Who comforteth us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort them which are in any trouble, by the comfort wherewith we ourselves are comforted of God. <sup>5</sup> For as the sufferings of Christ abound in us, so our consolation also aboundeth by Christ. <sup>6</sup> And whether we be afflicted, *it is* for your consolation and salvation, which is effectual in the enduring of the same sufferings which we also suffer: or whether we be comforted, *it is* for your consolation and salvation. <sup>7</sup> And our hope of you *is* stedfast, knowing, that as ye are partakers of the sufferings, so *shall ye be* also of the consolation. <sup>8</sup> For we would not, brethren, have you ignorant of our trouble which came to us in Asia, that we were pressed out of measure, above strength, insomuch that we despaired even of life: <sup>9</sup> But we had the sentence of death in ourselves, that we should not trust in ourselves, but in God which raiseth the dead: <sup>10</sup> Who delivered us from so great a death, and doth deliver: in whom we trust that he will yet deliver *us*; <sup>11</sup> Ye also helping together by prayer for us, that for the gift *bestowed* upon us by the means of many persons thanks may be given by many on our behalf.

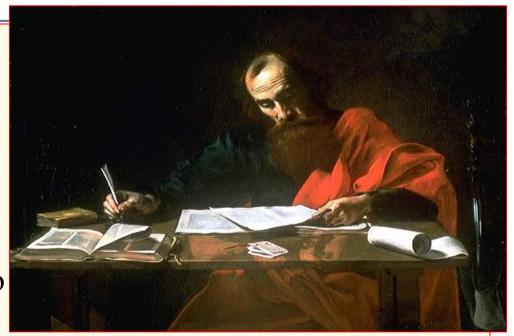

The Apostle Paul taught that "godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation ... but the sorrow of the world worketh death." Godly sorrow inspires change and hope through the Atonement of Jesus Christ. Worldly sorrow pulls us down, extinguishes hope, and persuades us to give in to further temptation.

Godly sorrow leads to conversion and a change of heart. It causes us to hate sin and love goodness. It encourages us to stand up and walk in the light of Christ's love. True repentance is about transformation, not torture or torment. Yes, heartfelt regret and true remorse for disobedience are often painful and very important steps in the sacred process of repentance. But when guilt leads to self-loathing or prevents us from rising up again, it is impeding rather than promoting our repentance.

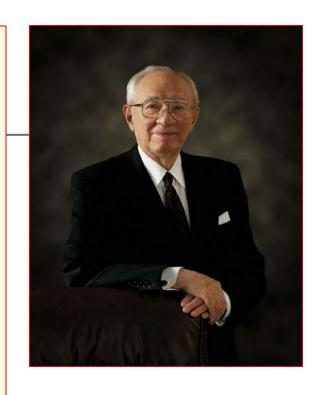

  - "For ye know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that, though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, that ye through his poverty might be rich." (8:9)
- Commendation of Titus (8:16–24)
- Appeal to Finish the Collection Before Paul Arrives (9:1–5)
- God Blesses the Liberal Giver (9:6–15)
  - "Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." (9:6–7 NIV)

"When you serve the poor, you serve the Master. I have no doubt of that whatsoever."

# Paul's Defense of His Apostolic Authority (10:1–13:10)

- After the mood of reconciliation exhibited earlier in the letter, **Paul** returns to an angry defense of his authority, suggesting that he was again challenged by someone in the Corinthian congregation
  - For *his* letters, say they, *are* weighty and powerful; but *his* bodily presence *is* weak, and *his* speech contemptible. **2** Corinthians 10:10
  - <sup>3</sup> But I fear, lest by any means, as the serpent beguiled Eve through his subtilty, so your minds should be corrupted from the simplicity that is in Christ. <sup>4</sup> For if he that cometh preacheth another Jesus, whom we have not preached, or *if* ye receive another spirit, which ye have not received, or another gospel, which ye have not accepted, ye might well bear with *him*. <sup>5</sup> For I suppose I was not a whit behind the **very chiefest apostles**. **2** Corinthians 11:3-5
  - "super-apostles" sometimes translated "very chiefest" (KJV) or "most eminent" (NKJV), this may have referred to senior apostles such as Peter or, more likely, false teachers who claimed special authority above that of the legitimate apostles

## Paul's Defense of his Apostolic Authority

His Suffering as an Apostle

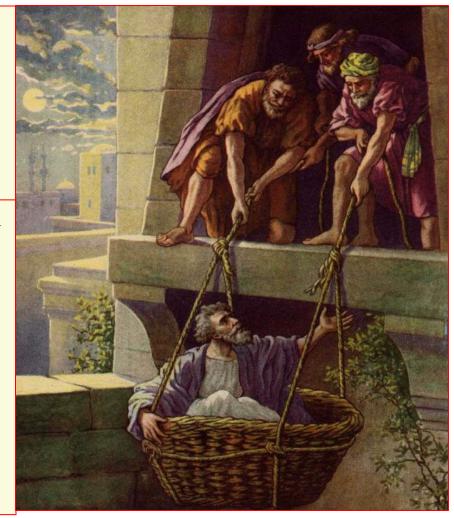
"Are they Hebrews? so am I. Are they Israelites? so am I. Are they the seed of Abraham? so am I. Are they ministers of Christ? (I speak as a fool) I am more; in labours more abundant, in stripes above measure, in prisons more frequent, in deaths oft. Of the Jews five times received I forty stripes save one. Thrice was I beaten with rods, once was I stoned, thrice I suffered shipwreck, a night and a day I have been in the deep; In journeyings often, in perils of waters, in perils of robbers, in perils by mine own countrymen, in perils by the heathen, in perils in the city, in perils in the wilderness, in perils in the sea, in perils among false brethren; In weariness and painfulness, in watchings often, in hunger and thirst, in fastings often, in cold and nakedness. Beside those things that are without, that which cometh upon me daily, the care of all the churches." (11:22–28)

<sup>32</sup> In Damascus the governor under Aretas the king kept the city of the Damascenes with a garrison, desirous to apprehend me: <sup>33</sup> *And through a window in a basket was I let down by the wall, and escaped his hands.* 

#### **2 Corinthians 11:32–33**

<sup>22</sup> But Saul increased the more in strength, and confounded the Jews which dwelt at Damascus, proving that this is very Christ. <sup>23</sup> And after that many days were fulfilled, the Jews took counsel to kill him: <sup>24</sup> But their laying await was known of Saul. ## Paul's Defense of his Apostolic Authority

#### Paul's Visions and Revelations (12:1–10)

- It is not expedient for me doubtless to glory. *I will come to visions and revelations of the Lord*. I knew a man in Christ above fourteen years ago, (whether in the body, I cannot tell; or whether out of the body, I cannot tell: God knoweth;) such an one caught up to the third heaven. And I knew such a man . . . How that he was caught up into paradise, and heard unspeakable words, which it is not lawful for a man to utter." (12:1–4)
  - Who is Paul talking about here? ("I knew a man in Christ")

#### ■ HIMSELF!!!

- Four known visions of Christ given to Paul
  - Road to Damascus (Acts 9:1–9; cf. Acts 22 and 25)
  - Vision at Corinth directing him to stay there longer (Acts 18:9–10)
  - Temple vision three years after conversion (related in Acts 22:17–21)
  - In prison at Jerusalem telling him he will testify in Rome (Acts 23:11)
  - If this "man in Christ" was Paul, it is a fifth, but the details "were not lawful" to relate
- "The heavens were opened upon us, and I beheld the celestial kingdom of God, and the glory thereof, whether in the body or out I cannot tell." (D&C 137:1)
- Perhaps the most sacred experience of Paul's life, vision of the Celestial Kingdom (cf. D&C 76)

## Paul's Thorn in the Flesh

<sup>7</sup> And lest I should be exalted above measure through the abundance of the revelations, there was given to me a thorn in the flesh, the messenger of Satan to buffet me, lest I should be exalted above measure. <sup>8</sup> For this thing I besought the Lord thrice, that it might depart from me. <sup>9</sup> And he said unto me, My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness. Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me. <sup>10</sup> Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in necessities, in persecutions, in distresses for Christ's sake: for when I am weak, then am I strong.

#### **2 Corinthians 12:7–10**

"And if men come unto me I will show unto them their weakness. I give unto men weakness that they may be humble; and my grace is sufficient for all men that humble themselves before me; for if they humble themselves before me, and have faith in me, then will I make weak things become strong unto them. Behold, I will show unto the Gentiles their weakness, and I will show unto them that faith, hope and charity bringeth unto me—the fountain of all righteousness." (Ether 12:27–28)

**Jacob 4:7**, "Nevertheless, the Lord God showeth us our weakness that we may know that it is by his grace . . . that we have power to do these things."

Where is then the blessedness ye spake of? for I bear you record, that, if *it had been* possible, ye would have <u>plucked out your own eyes</u>, and have given them to me.

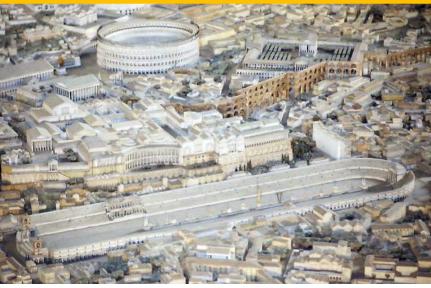

  - Truly the signs of an apostle were wrought among you in all *patience*, in *signs*, and *wonders*, and *mighty deeds*." (12:12)
  - "All the marks characteristic of a true apostle have been at work among you: complete perseverance, signs, marvels, demonstrations of power." (12:12 NJB)
- Paul's Concern for the Corinthian Church (12:14–18)
- Appeal to Repent Before Paul Comes (12:19–13:10)
  - Therefore I write these things being absent, lest being present I should use sharpness, according to the power which the Lord hath given me to edification, and not to destruction. Finally, brethren, farewell. Be perfect, be of good comfort, be of one mind, live in peace; and the God of love and peace shall be with you." (13:10–11)

# Epistle to the Romans







## When did Paul write Romans?

"Now I go unto Jerusalem to minister to the saints...to make a certain contribution for the poor saints which are at Jerusalem... When therefore I have performed this, and have sealed to them this fruit, I will come by you into Spain." (Rom. 15:25,28)

"[While in Corinth] Paul purposed in the spirit, when he had passed through Macedonia and Achaia, to go to Jerusalem, saying, After I have been there, I must also see Rome." (Acts 19:21)

"I came [to Jerusalem] to bring alms to my nation, and offerings." (Acts 24:17)

<sup>\*</sup>Paul wrote Romans during 3<sup>rd</sup> mission while preparing to go to Jerusalem

### **Romans**

**Date:** In the winter of 57/58 from Corinth

**To:** To God's beloved in Rome (i.e. Roman Church)

From: Corinth, more specifically Cenchreae



"I commend to you our sister Phoebe, a deacon (διάκονος) of the church at Cenchreae." (Romans 16:1)

"We went toward Rome. And from thence, when the brethren heard of us, they came to meet us."

(Acts 28:14–15)

\*Paul did <u>not</u> establish Christianity in Rome

\*Christians were in Rome <u>before</u> Paul arrived

\*Paul's <u>other</u> epistles were written to Christian congregations he had established. \*Why did Paul write to a Christian congregation he did not establish?



"[I desire to] have a prosperous journey by the will of God to come unto you...that I might have some fruit among you also... I am ready to preach the gospel to you that are at Rome also." (Rom. 1:10,13)



Reason 1: Paul wanted to preach the gospel at Rome (even though someone else had preached it there first)

"I am not ashamed of the Gospel of Jesus Christ." (Rom. 1:16)

\*Likely some Jewish Christians told nasty stories about Paul's effort among Gentiles. Paul was defending himself.

"I have written the more boldly unto you...that the offering up of the Gentiles might be acceptable [to you]." (Rom. 15:15–16)



\*Paul explained his views about Gentiles entering gospel covenant. (to clear his reputation and make the Roman Christians more willing to assist him journey to Spain.)

Reason 2: Paul also wanted Roman saints to understand and accept his mission to the Gentiles.

#### **Romans 15:24**

<sup>24</sup> Whensoever *I take my journey into Spain*, I will come to you: for I trust to see you in my journey, and to be brought on my way thitherward by you, if first I be somewhat filled with your *company*.

### Romans 15:28-29

when therefore I have performed this, and have sealed to them this fruit, *I will come by you into Spain*. <sup>29</sup> And I am sure that, when I come unto you, I shall come in the fulness of the blessing of the gospel of Christ.



# Reason 3: Paul wanted the Roman Christians to help him go on a mission to Spain

### Overarching Reasons why Paul wrote Romans

Reason 1: Paul wanted to preach the gospel at Rome (even though someone else had preached it there first)

Reason 2: Paul also wanted Roman saints to understand and accept his mission to the Gentiles.

Reason 3: Paul wanted the Roman Christians to help him go on a mission to Spain

# Audience?

"We have received grace and apostleship, for obedience to the faith among all <u>nations</u>... among whom are <u>ye also</u>." (Rom. 1:5-6)

"nations" = "gentiles." (Greek: *ethnos*)



"Oftentimes I purposed to come unto you...that I might have some fruit among you also, even as among other Gentiles." (Rom. 1:13)

= Gentile Christians are addressed

# Audience?

"What shall we say then that Abraham our father, as pertaining to the flesh, has found?..." (Rom. 4:1)

"Know ye not brethren, (for I speak to them that know the law)..." (Rom. 7:1)



- \* "the law" = "the law of Moses."
- = Jewish Christians are addressed

# "History" of the Roman Church



- Rome had a large Jewish community (40,000–50,000 in the first century A.D.).
- Jewish Christians may have arrived in Rome in the 40's
  - Acts 2:10 mentions "strangers from Rome, Jews and proselytes"
  - Returning to the capital, they may have spread the gospel message with other Jews

- Claudius expelled Jews from the city in A.D. 49 over disturbances over "Chrestus" (Suet. *Claud*. 25.3)
  - Paul met Priscilla and Aquila, Jewish Christian refugees from Rome, in Corinth (Acts. 18:1–3; Romans 16:3–4) and had relatives there (Andronicus and Junia, 16.7).
- After the death of Claudius in A.D. 54, Jews and Jewish Christians were allowed to return to Rome
- In the meantime the Church had continued to grow among Gentiles
- There may have been some tension between them and the returning Jewish

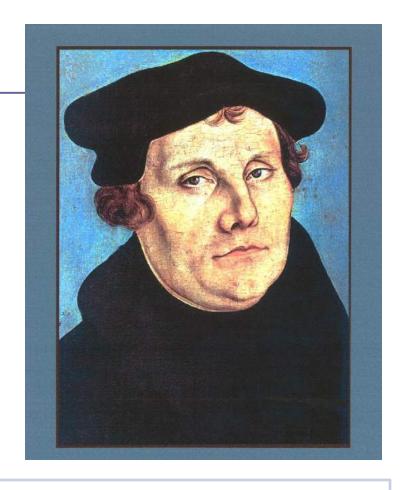

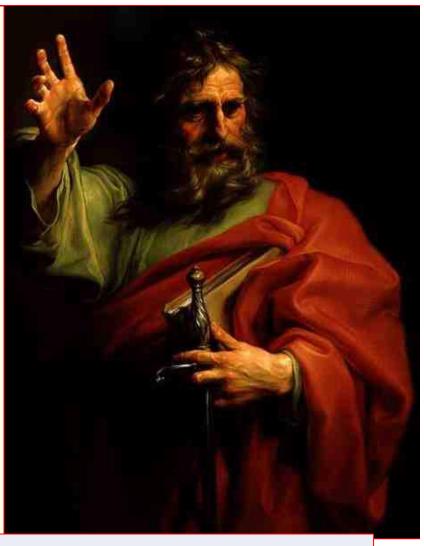

# What is Paul Saying Here?

### Romans 2:25–29

- <sup>25</sup> For circumcision verily profiteth, if thou keep the law: but if thou be a breaker of the law, thy circumcision is made uncircumcision.
- <sup>26</sup> Therefore if the uncircumcision keep the righteousness of the law, shall not his uncircumcision be counted for circumcision?
- <sup>27</sup> And shall not uncircumcision which is by nature, if it fulfil the law, judge thee, who by the letter and circumcision dost transgress the law?
- <sup>28</sup> For he is not a Jew, which is one outwardly; neither *is that* circumcision, which is outward in the flesh:
- <sup>29</sup> But he *is* a Jew, which is one inwardly; and circumcision *is that* of the heart, in the spirit, *and* not in the letter; whose praise *is* not of men, but of God.

### **Romans 3:1–2**

<sup>1</sup> What advantage then hath the Jew? or what profit *is there* of circumcision?

\*If we are all sinners, and cannot boast of how well we keep the law, then **how can we possibly be saved**?

(Answer: Justification through the Grace of Christ)

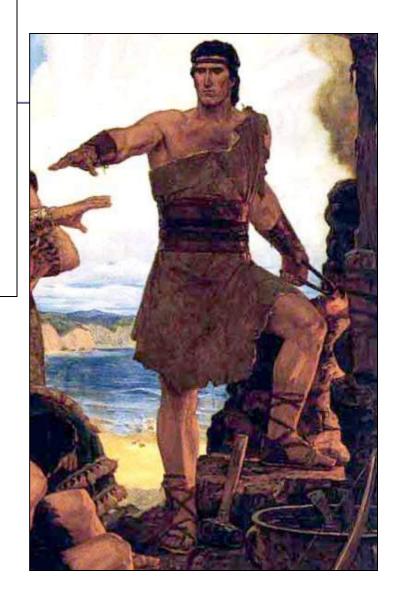

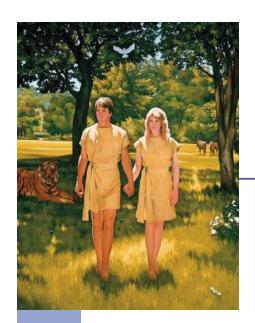

# The Example of Abraham Romans 4:1–15

<sup>3</sup> For what saith the scripture? *Abraham believed God, and it was counted unto him for righteousness* (Gen 15:6).

#### Romans 4:9-13

- <sup>9</sup> Cometh this blessedness then upon the circumcision only, or upon the uncircumcision also? for we say that faith was reckoned to Abraham for righteousness.
- <sup>10</sup> How was it then reckoned? when he was in circumcision, or in uncircumcision? Not in circumcision, but in uncircumcision.
- <sup>11</sup> And he received the sign of circumcision, a seal of the righteousness of the faith which *he had yet* being uncircumcised: that he might be the father of all them that believe, though they be not circumcised; that righteousness might be imputed unto them also:

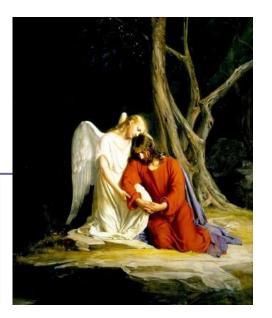

### Adam & Christ

(Fall & Atonement)

Wherefore, as by *one man sin* entered into the world, and death by sin; and so *death passed upon all men*, for that all have sinned:

### What is the main rhetorical thrust of this chapter?

\*If the actions of one man (i.e. Adam) can bring death and sin, then it is not hard to believe that the actions of one man (i.e. Christ) can bring life and atonement

But not as the offence, so also is the free gift. For if through the offence of one many be dead, much more the grace of God, and the gift by grace, which is by one man,

Jesus Christ, hath abounded unto many. (Romans 5:15)

Therefore as by the offence of one judgment came upon all men to condemnation; even so by the righteousness of one the free gift came upon all men unto justification of life. (Romans 5:18)

For as by one man's disobedience many were made sinners, so by the obedience of one shall many be made righteous. (Romans 5:19)

## Romans 5:12 & Original Sin

#### **Article of Faith 2**

We believe that men will be *punished for their own sins*, and *not for Adam's transgression*.

For the natural man is an enemy to God, and has been from the fall of Adam, and will be, forever and ever, unless he yields to the enticings of the Holy Spirit, and puts off the natural man and becomes a saint through the atonement of Christ the Lord. (Mosiah 3:19)

- 1. According to Augustine Original Sin consists of the guilt of Adam which all humans inherit.
- 2. As sinners, humans are utterly depraved in nature, lack the freedom to do good, and cannot respond to the will of God without divine grace.
- 3. Grace is irresistible, results in conversion, and leads to perseverance.

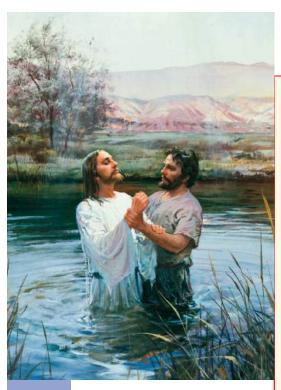


### **Atonement**

<sup>10</sup> For if, when we were enemies, we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, being reconciled, we shall be saved by his life. <sup>11</sup> And not only so, but we also joy in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom we have now received the **atonement**. **Romans 5:10–11** 

Gethsemane is the beginning, Calvary the middle, and the Resurrection the finale – they are all part of the same process!

Atonement (At+one+ment), from medieval Latin adunamentum



# Baptism

<sup>3</sup> Know ye not, that so many of us as were baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into his death? 4 Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life. <sup>5</sup> For if we have been planted together in the likeness of his death, we shall be also *in the likeness* of *his* resurrection: <sup>6</sup> Knowing this, that our old man is crucified with him, that the body of sin might be destroyed, that henceforth we should not serve sin.

**Romans 6:3–6** 

### Twofold symbolism of Baptism

- 1) Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection.
- 2) Our death to sin and new life in Christ

Ideally at baptism we become born again! (cf. John 5:3-5)

# Two Analogies

### ■ Analogy from Slavery (6:15–23)

■ "Do you not know that if you present yourselves to anyone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin, which leads to death, or of obedience, which leads to righteousness? . . . and that you, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness." (6:16, 18 NRSV; "slaves" is stronger than the KJV "servant")

### ■ Analogy from Marriage (7:1–6)

- For the woman which hath an husband is bound by the law to *her* husband so long as he liveth; but if the husband be dead, she is loosed from the law of *her* husband . . . Wherefore, my brethren, ye also are become dead to the law by the body of Christ; *that ye should be married to another, even to him who is raised from the dead, that we should bring forth fruit unto God.*" (7:2, 4)
- Now that the law has died, Christians are free to marry another, even Christ
- Jews were not bound by the Mosaic Law when dead; sharing in Christ's death frees us from the Law and allows us to have new life in the Law of the Gospel

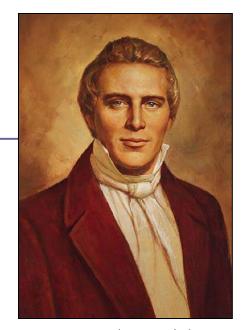
Compare with the Book of Mormon teaching of Alma<sup>2</sup> regarding high priests

"And this is the manner after which they were ordained—being called and prepared from the foundation of the world according to the foreknowledge of God, on account of their exceeding faith and good works; in the first place being left to choose good or evil; therefore they having chosen good, and exercising exceedingly great faith, are called with a holy calling . . ." (Alma 13:3)

"Just because we were chosen 'there and then,' surely does not mean we can be indifferent 'here and now.' Whether foreordination for men, or foredesignation for women, those called and prepared must also prove 'chosen, and faithful.'" (Neal A. Maxwell, CR October 1985, 21)

"The whole chapter [Roman 9] had reference to the *priesthood and the* house of Israel, and unconditional election of eternal life was not taught by the Apostles. God did elect or predestinate that all those who would be saved should be saved in Christ Jesus, and through obedience to the gospel. But he passes over no man's sins, but visits them with correction, and if his Children will not repent of their sins, he will discard them."

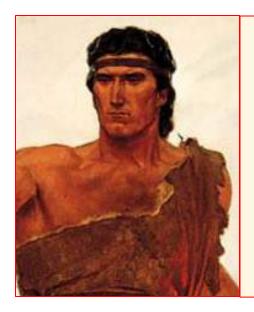
### What is the mystery?

\*The mystery is the ironic way that Jews and Gentiles have received the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

\*The original covenant people will not accept the covenant until "the fulness of the Gentiles."

"The time cometh that [Christ] shall manifest himself unto all nations, both unto the Jews and also unto the Gentiles; and after he has manifested himself unto the Jews and also unto the Gentiles, then he shall manifest himself unto the Gentiles and also unto the Jews, and the last shall be first, and the first shall be last."

1 Nephi 13:41–42



\*Nephi was told in vision (c. 595 BC) that the Gospel would be offered to the House of Israel <u>first</u> and then to Gentiles.

\*The reverse would happen in the Latter-days.

"[The Jews] shall be scattered among all nations... But they shall be gathered again; but they shall remain [scattered] until the times of the Gentiles be fulfilled... And when the times of the Gentiles is come in, a light shall break forth among them that sit in darkness [i.e. the Jews], and it shall be the fullness of my gospel." (D&C 45:19,25,28)

  - Although Paul rarely quotes the words of Jesus directly, some of the his teachings are apparent here: "Bless them which persecute you: bless, and curse not. Rejoice with them that do rejoice, and weep with them that weep." (12:14–15)
- **Submission to Authorities** (13:1–7)
  - Let every soul be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and the authorities that exist are appointed by God. . . . Render therefore to all their due: taxes to whom taxes *are due*, customs to whom customs, fear to whom fear, honor to whom honor." (13:1, 7 NKJV)
- Love for One Another (13:8–10)
  - "... Thou shalt not commit adultery, Thou shalt not kill, Thou shalt not steal, Thou shalt not bear false witness, Thou shalt not covet; and if there be any other commandment, it is briefly comprehended in this saying, namely, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. Love worketh no ill to his neighbour: therefore love is the fulfilling of the law." (13:9–10)

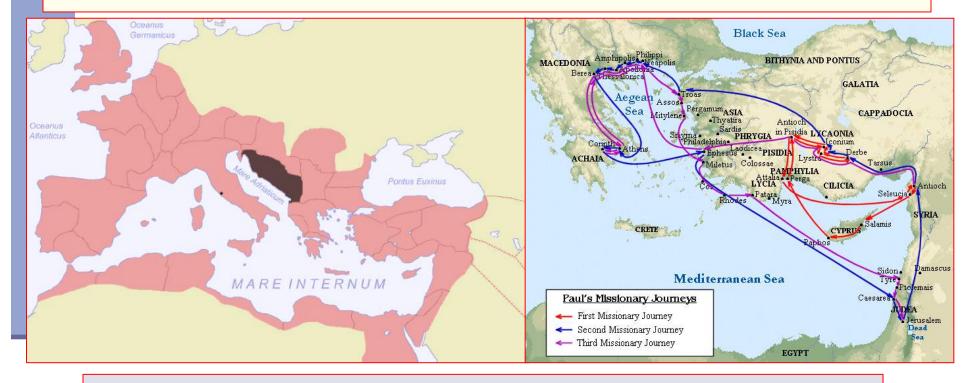

- Priscilla and Aquilla seem to be back in Rome and a branch of the church is meeting in their home
   Romans 16:3-5
- At least two to four other branches are mentioned (16:10–11, 14–15)
- Paul sends greetings to various people



### **Ancient Organization of Women in the Early Church?**

"Although the name [Relief Society] may be of modern date, the institution is of ancient origin. We were told by [the prophet Joseph Smith] that the same organization existed in the church anciently."

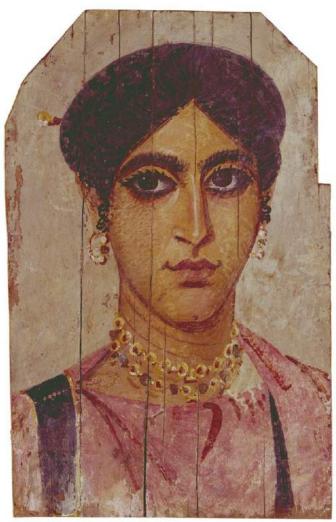

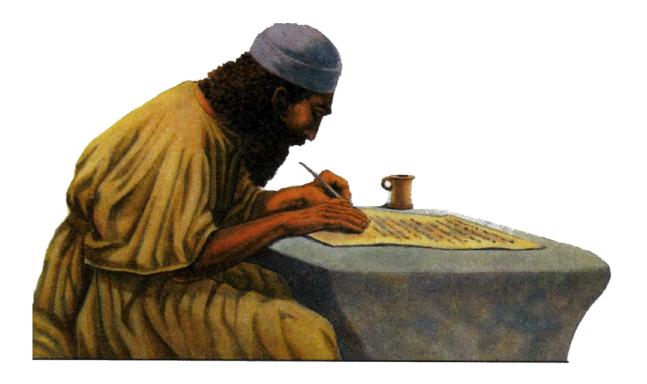


Mummy Portrait of a Woman 1st Century A.D., Fayum (Egypt)

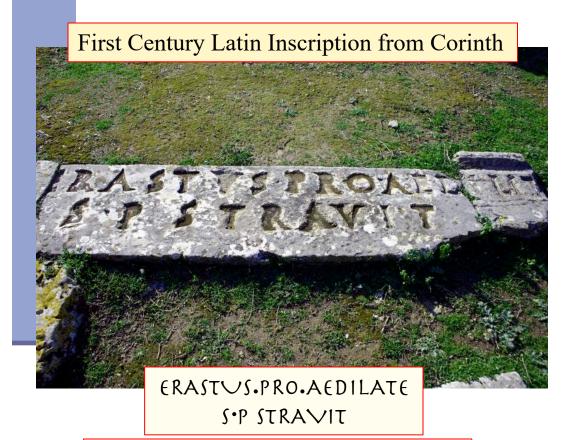

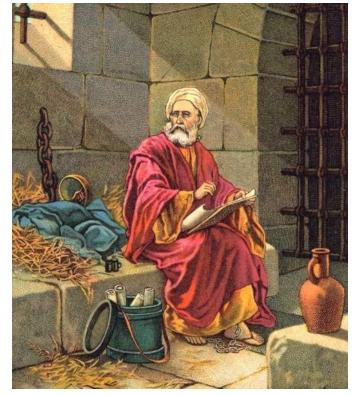

### By whom was it sent?

Tychicus:

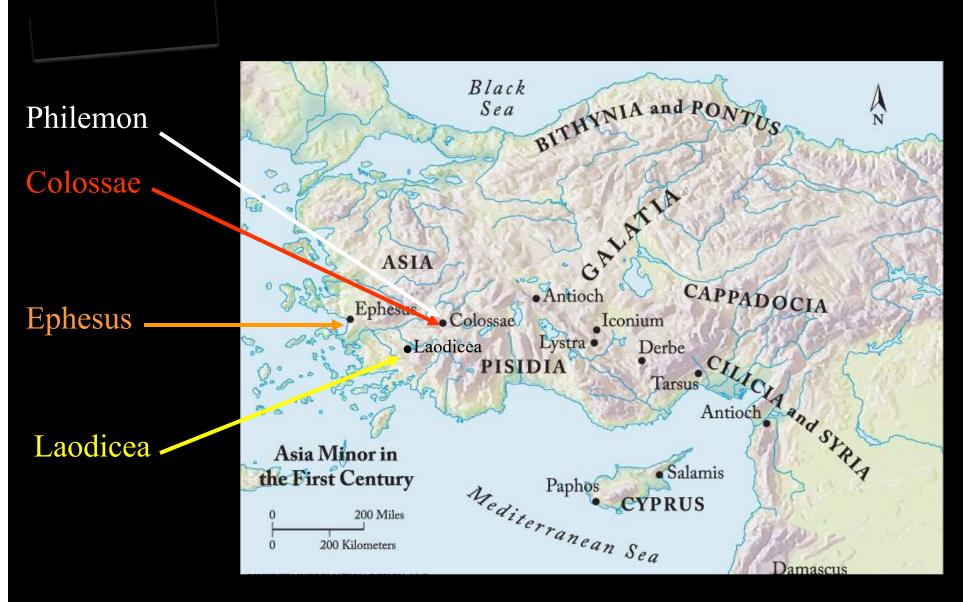
But that ye also may know my affairs, and how I do, <u>Tychicus</u>, a <u>beloved</u> <u>brother</u> and faithful minister in the Lord, shall make known to you all things: Whom I have sent unto you for the same purpose, <u>that ye might know our</u> <u>affairs</u>, and <u>that</u> he <u>might comfort your hearts</u>.

Eph 6:21–22 (compare Acts 20:4; Col. 4:7, 18; 2 Tit. 3:12)

■ And Tychicus have I sent to Ephesus. (2 Tim. 4:12)

"All my state shall Tychicus declare unto you, who is a beloved brother, and a faithful minister and fellowservant in the Lord:" (Col. 4:7)

### Paul and "Predestination" Again

"According as he hath chosen us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before him in love: Having <u>predestinated</u> us unto <u>the adoption of children</u> *by Jesus Christ to himself*, according to the good pleasure of his will . . . In whom also we have obtained an inheritance, being <u>predestinated</u> according to the purpose of him who worketh all things after the counsel of his own will . . . (1:4–5, 11–12)

Predestine = "decide from the beginning or beforehand, predestine, foreordain; set apart from the beginning or beforehand ( $prooriz\bar{o}$ ).

#### Acts 4:28

For to do whatsoever thy hand and thy counsel **determined before** to be done.

#### Romans 8:29-30

<sup>29</sup> For whom he did foreknow, he also did **predestinate** to be conformed to the image of his Son, that he might be the firstborn among many brethren. <sup>30</sup> Moreover whom he did **predestinate**, them he also called: and whom he called, them he also justified: and whom he justified, them he also glorified. ### Saved by Grace

### Ephesians 2:1–10

- "For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: *it is* the gift of God: Not of works, lest any man should boast." (2:8–9)
  - are ye <u>saved</u>: Salvation, perhaps broader than the straightforward justification of Galatians and Romans
    - Resurrection: free gift, "unconditional grace"
    - Redemption: the gift of forgiveness that comes with justification, still a gift but one that we put ourselves in a position to receive, sometimes termed "conditional grace" which comes in return for faith
  - **through faith:** not just belief but <u>trust</u> in Christ that causes us to take him at his word, *lay hold of the gift that he offers* 
    - <u>Exposition:</u> taking Christ at his word means trusting that when we believe in him, repent, and are baptized we will be forgiven!
- For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus <u>unto good</u> <u>works</u>, which God hath before ordained that <u>we should walk</u> in them.

Ephesians 2:10

### Unity of Jews and Gentiles

- <sup>12</sup> That at that time ye were without Christ, being aliens from the commonwealth of Israel, and strangers from the covenants of promise, having no hope, and without God in the world:
- <sup>13</sup> But now in Christ Jesus ye who sometimes were far off are made nigh by the blood of Christ.
- <sup>14</sup> For he is our peace, who hath made both one, and hath broken down the middle wall of partition *between us*;

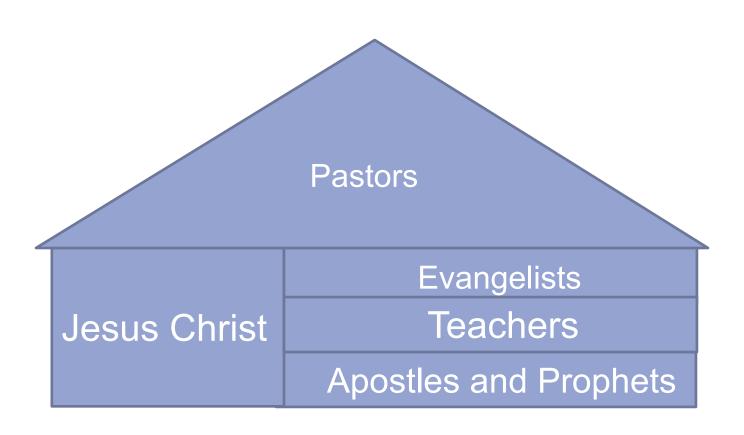


Partition between "court of gentiles" and "court of Israel"

# Gentiles are Fellowheirs with Israel 3:1–12

- Paul talks about the "mystery" that was made known unto him (vv. 3, 9)
  - cf. Rom 11:25 "mystery ... fullness of the gentiles"
- vv.6–7: "That the Gentiles should be fellowheirs, and of the same body, and partakers of his promise in Christ by the gospel: Whereof I was made a minister, according to the gift of the grace of God given unto me by the effectual working of his power."

#### ■ 3:17–19, Christ Loves them

"<sup>17</sup> That Christ may dwell in your hearts by faith; that ye, being rooted and grounded in love, <sup>18</sup> May be able to comprehend with all saints what *is* the breadth, and length, and depth, and height; <sup>19</sup> And to know the love of Christ, which passeth knowledge, that ye might be filled with all the fulness of God."

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## Paul's Counsel to the Ephesians

4:17-32

- v. 17: walk not as other Gentiles walk (i.e. live as other Gentiles live)
- vv. 22–24: "That ye put off concerning the former conversation the old man, which is corrupt according to the deceitful lusts; And be renewed in the spirit of your mind; And that ye put on the new man, which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness." (v.22) "former conversation" = "former life"
- v. 25: do not lie
- v. 26: "be ye angry, and not sin:" JST: "can ye be angry and not sin"
- v. 28: do not steal
- v. 29: do not speak evil
- v. 32: be kind and forgive one another

# Paul's Counsel to the Ephesians Cont.

5:1-20

- v. 2: walk in love (i.e. go around with love)
- **cf.** 1 Cor 6:9–11
  - v. 3: avoid fornication, impurity, and greed
  - v. 4: "Neither filthiness, nor foolish talking, nor jesting, which are not convenient": better understood as: "neither obscene, foolish, or vulgar speech, which is not befitting"
  - v. 5: fornicator, impure person, one who is greedy will not inherit "the kingdom of Christ and God"
  - v. 6: God will punish the disobedient
  - v. 7: do not associate with who commit such things
  - vv. 8–13: formerly you walked in darkness but now in the light
- v. 14: Wherefore he saith, "Awake thou that sleepest, and arise from the dead," (cf. Isa 26:19, 60:1–2) and Christ shall give thee light.

### Serving Each Other

Household Code, Ephesians 5:21–6:9

- Mutual submission and responsibilities
- Wives and Husbands (5:21–33)
  - Submit one to another: "submitting yourselves one to another in the fear of God" (v. 21).
  - (v. 22) the word "submit" is not actually in the verse but there by implication from v. 21
  - Think of husbands "presiding" and not "ruling" over families
- "Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ also loved the church, and gave himself for it . . . So ought men to love their wives as their own bodies. He that loveth his wife loveth himself." (5:25–28)
- Children and Parents (6:1–4)
  - "Children, obey your parents in the Lord: for this is right. Honour thy father and mother . . ." (6:1-2)
  - And, ye fathers, provoke not your children to wrath: but bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord." (6:4)
- Slaves and Masters (6:5–9): KJV "Servant" but Greek "Slaves"

### Roman Slavery

- 1 out 6 persons was a slave, about 10 million slaves in the empire
- Roman slavery **not** based on race
- Master literally owned the slave as property
  - It was not a crime to kill one's slave; though this did happen it was uncommon
- Not always an abusive relationship
  - Many slaves were well educated, trained as teachers/tutors
  - Slaves could hold positions of some authority
  - Slaves could own their own property, some even owned their own slaves
  - Imperial slaves and freedmen (familia Caesaris) held important governmental positions



### Jewish Slavery

- Recognized in the Law of Moses
- Not Racial
- Temporary (6 years)

### Ways to Become a Roman Slave

- Prisoner of War
- People Sell themselves/ParentsSell Children
- Punishment for crime
- Kidnap children
- Exposure of infants
- As a result of excessive debt

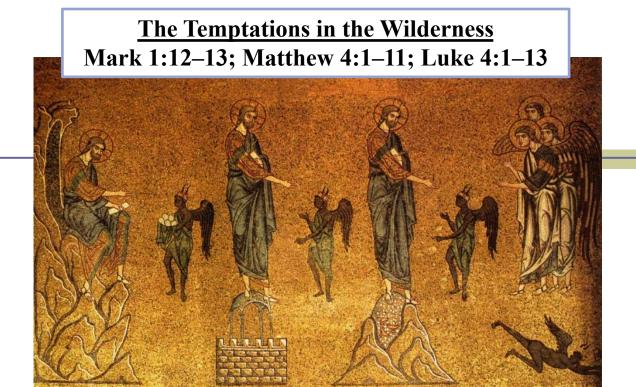

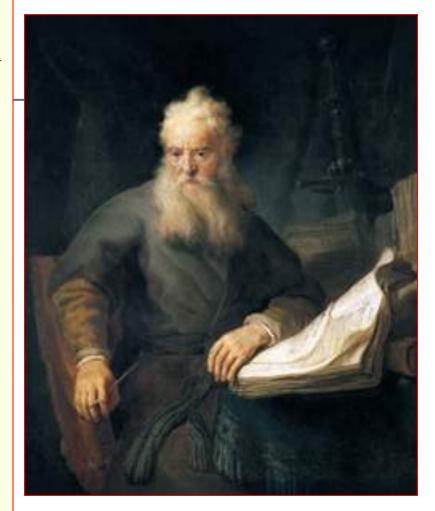

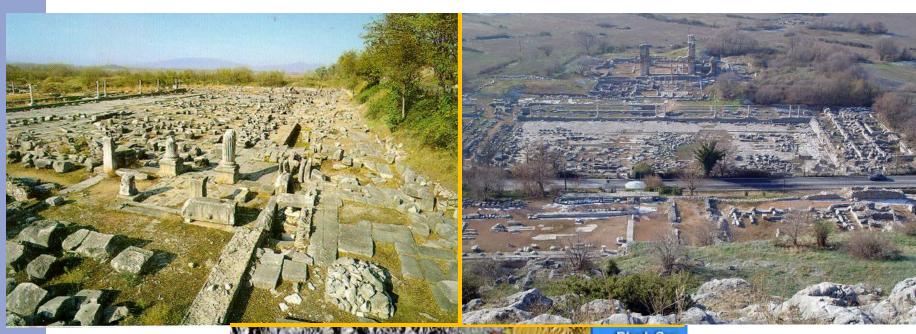

#### Paul's Prison Letters

Acts ends with Paul in Rome under house arrest waiting to have a hearing before the emperor (c. A.D. 60–62).



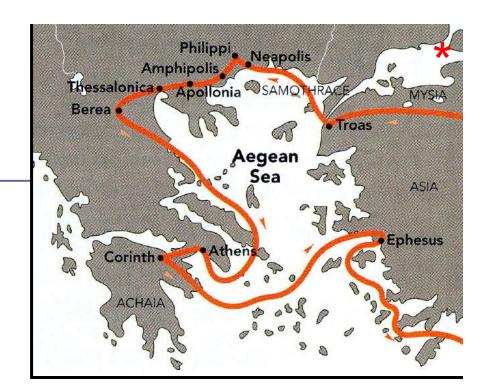
- It is therefore possible that Paul wrote his "prison epistles" from Rome.
- However, he is also under house arrest in Caesarea for nearly two years under the governor Felix (c. A.D. 57–59); perhaps some of these letter were written then.

#### Prison Epistles

- Philippians, Colossians, Philemon, Ephesians, 2 Timothy
- Note: 1 Timothy and Titus are <u>not</u> prison epistles

## Philippians

- Philippians is one of the "imprisonment" letters
  - Early to mid 60s AD



- Philippian branch established during the "Second" Missionary Journey of AD 49–52
  - Met Lydia and converted her household the first Sabbath there
  - Paul and Silas imprisoned and mistreated but later released for being Romans
  - Paul stayed in close touch with the church and this was the only one from which he accepted gifts (Phil 4:16)

## Philippians

- Occasion of Philippians
- Philippians had heard of Paul's imprisonment and sent
   Epaphroditus to him with a gift (probably of money for his support)
- Epaphroditus relayed news of the Philippian church to Paul



- From Paul's letter it seems that the Philippians are having (relatively) few problems.

## Philippians

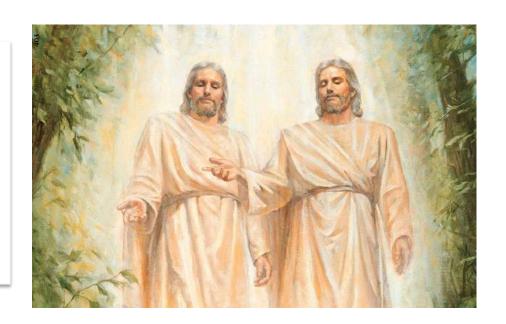
- Paul's Situation in Prison (1:12–18a)
  - "Now I want you to know, brothers, that what has happened to me has really served to advance the gospel." (1:12 NIV)
  - "My chains in Christ have become well known not only to all the Praetorium, but to everybody else" (1:13 NJB)
  - Praetorium can refer to the emperor's palace, the governor's headquarters, a commander's tent, the imperial guard, or any official's body guard . . .
  - "All the saints salute you, chiefly they that are of Caesar's household." (Phil 4:22)
- Hope for Deliverance and Attitude towards Death (1:18b–26)
  - "For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain. . . . For I am in a strait betwixt two, having a desire to depart, and to be with Christ; which is far better: Nevertheless to abide in the flesh is more needful for you." (1:21, 23–24)
- **■** Imitate Christ (2:1–11)
  - Christological Hymn (2:6–11)
  - One of several **hymns**, probably earlier than Paul, incorporated into New Testament texts
  - May have had Aramaic precedents that were as early as the mid-30s!
  - Christology: the focus on the person and work of Jesus: Who he is and what he did

Philippians 2:6–11

"Christ Jesus, who being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God; But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men; and being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross." (Philip. 2:5-8)

"In the form of God" =
"in <u>nature/status</u> like God"

(Paul is not merely talking about shape or looks, but <u>divine nature</u> <u>and status</u>)



Philippians 2:6–11

"Christ Jesus, who being in the form of God, thought it not <u>robbery</u> to be equal with God; But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men; and being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross." (Philip. 2:5-8)

Philippians 2:6 who, although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, (Phil. 2:6 NAS)

"Robbery" = "something to be clutched to one's self & not given up"

Philippians 2:6–11

"Christ Jesus, who being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God; But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men; and being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross." (Philip. 2:5-8)

"Made himself of no reputation" = "he emptied himself" (ἐκένωσεν)

but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, Philippians 2:7 NRS

#### **CONDESCENSION**

To (1) voluntarily give up superior rank or dignity, and to (2) come to an inferior circumstance in order to (3) extend mercy to others.

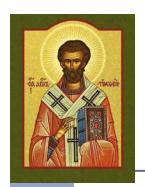

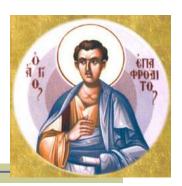

#### **■ Timothy**

- "For I have no man likeminded (ἰσόψυχος), who will naturally care for your state. (2:20)
- "But ye know the proof of him, that, as a son with the father, he hath served with me in the gospel." (2:22)

#### Epaphroditus

- "Yet I supposed it necessary to send to you Epaphroditus, my brother, and companion in labour, and fellowsoldier, but your messenger (ἀπόστολος), and he that ministered to my wants." (2:25)
- "For indeed he was sick nigh unto death: but God had mercy on him; and not on him only, but on me also, lest I should have sorrow upon sorrow." (2:27)

# Warnings Against False Teachers (3:1b-4:1)

- Breaking with the Past: Beware of the Dogs Confident in the Flesh! (3:1b–11)
- The "dogs" are apparently Judaizers, like those who had misled the Galatians, because they "have confidence in the flesh," putting confidence in outward signs of the law such as circumcision
  - <sup>5</sup> Circumcised the eighth day, of the stock of Israel, of the <u>tribe of Benjamin</u>, an Hebrew of the Hebrews; as touching the law, <u>a Pharisee</u>; <sup>6</sup> Concerning zeal, <u>persecuting the church</u>; touching the righteousness which is in the law, blameless. (vv. 5–6)
- But what things were gain to me, those I counted loss for Christ. (v. 7)
- "I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus. (v. 14)"
  - \*"God" is not a "calling" like we think of church callings
- Better translation: "I press forward to the mark of the exalted prize which God calls me to in Christ Jesus."
  - God is the one doing the "calling"

## Philippians 3:17–21

<sup>17</sup> Brethren, be followers together of me, and mark them which walk so as ye have us for an ensample.

<sup>18</sup> (For many walk, of whom I have told you often, and now tell you even weeping, *that they are* the enemies of the cross of Christ:

<sup>19</sup> Whose end *is* destruction, whose God *is their* belly, and *whose* glory *is* in their shame, who mind earthly things.)

<sup>20</sup> For our <u>conversation is in heaven</u>; from whence also we look for the Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ:

<sup>21</sup> Who shall change our vile body, that it may be fashioned like unto his glorious body, according to the working whereby he is able even to subdue all things unto himself.

#### **Ethical Exhortations**

4:2-9

- Euodia and Syntyche Urged to Be of One Mind (4:2–3)
- "I beseech Euodias, and beseech Syntyche, that they be of the same mind in the Lord. And I intreat thee also, true yokefellow, help those women which laboured with me in the gospel . . ."
- "true yokefellow" maybe also "loyal Syzygus"
- σύζυγος also means "spouse" or "wife"
  - Clement of Alexandria, *Strom.* 3.53.1: "Paul did not hesitate to address his own spouse in a certain epistle (phil 4:3) whom he did not bring with him for the convenience of his ministry."
  - Origen, Comm. Rom. 1.1: "Truly free is he who comes to Christ through pure chastity without a wife; he, however, who is shown to be the servant of Christ, yet serves with complete virtue. Therefore Paul, as some relate, was called while in possession of a wife, about whom he spoke when he wrote to the Philippians: 'Therefore I ask you, genuine match, to help those women,' who since he was set free from her by mutual agreement, called himself the servant of Christ.'
- **General Admonitions** (4:4–9)
- **Be careful for nothing**; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God. And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus." (4:6-7)
- "Do not worry about anything" (NRSV)

#### The Admonition of Paul

#### Philippians 4:8

Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things.

#### The 13th Article of Faith

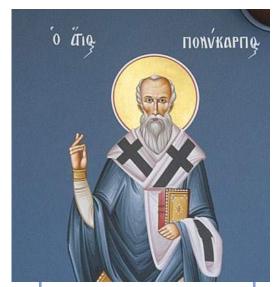

# Are there other letters to the Philippians by Paul?

"For neither I nor anyone like me can keep pace with the wisdom of the blessed and glorious Paul. When he was with you in the presence of the people of that time, he actually and reliably taught the word concerning the truth. *And when he was absent he wrote you letters*; if you study *them* carefully, you will be able to build yourselves up in the faith that has been given you."

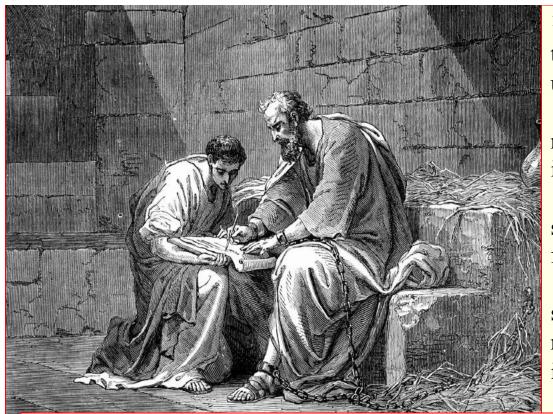
## Philemon



- Date: Early to mid 60s A.D.
- Addressee: Philemon, head of a house-church; Apphia (probably his wife); Archippus (perhaps his son), and the branch in his house (probably in Colossae)
- **Purpose:** To intercede on behalf of Onesimus, a slave, with his master, Philemon
  - It seems that Onesimus may have run away Philemon
  - If not, he has wronged Philemon in some way

"Paul, a prisoner of Jesus Christ...being such an one as Paul the aged, and now also a prisoner of Jesus Christ. I beseech thee for my son Onesimus, whom I have begotten in my bonds." (Phlm. 1:1,10)





- 13 Whom I would have retained with me, that in thy stead he might have ministered unto me in the bonds of the gospel:
- <sup>14</sup> But without thy mind would I do nothing; that thy benefit should not be as it were of necessity, but willingly.

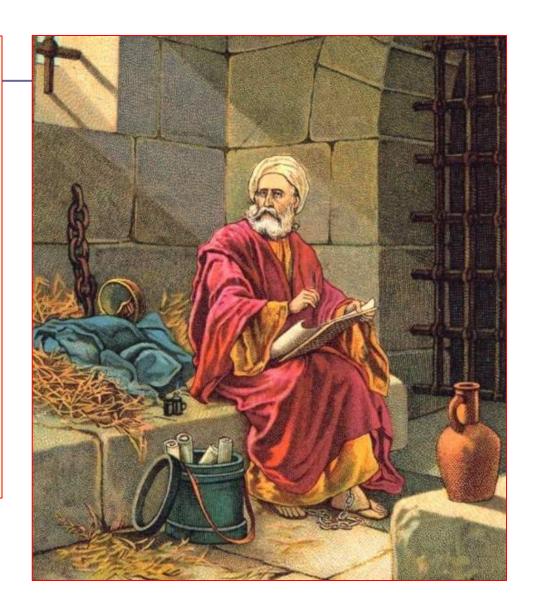

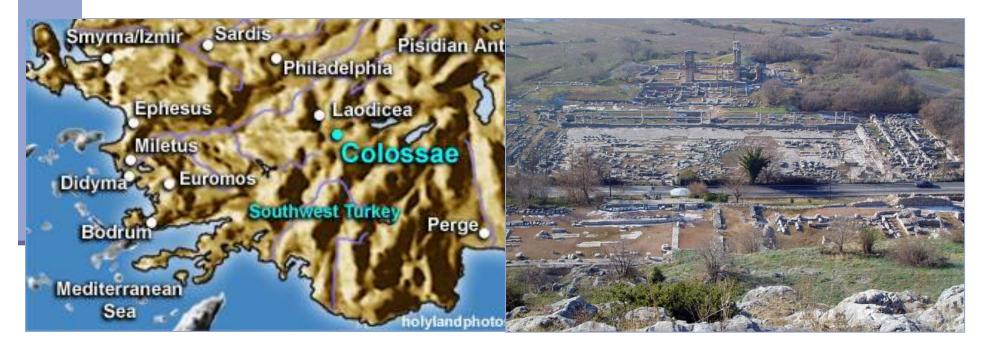
## What ever happened to Onesimus?

- That Philemon reacted generously is almost certain, or the letter would not have been preserved
- Ignatius of Antioch, a Christian bishop in the early second century, claims that a Onesimus was bishop of Ephesus in A.D. 110 (Eph. 1:3)
  - I received, therefore, your whole multitude in the name of God, through **Onesimus**, a man of inexpressible love, **and your bishop in the flesh**, whom I pray you by Jesus Christ to love, and that you would all seek to be like him. And blessed be He who has granted unto you, being worthy, to obtain such an excellent bishop.

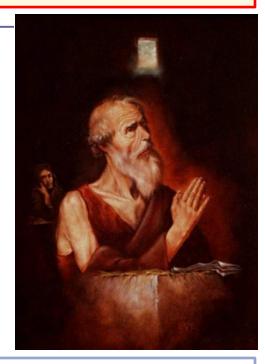

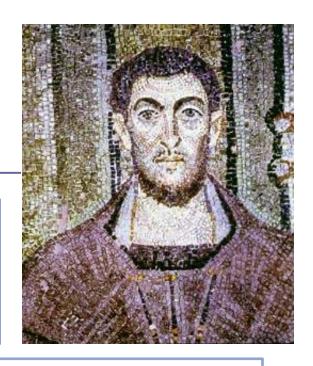

"All my state shall <u>Tychicus</u> declare unto you...whom I have sent unto you... with <u>Onesimus</u>, a faithful and beloved brother, who is <u>one of you</u>. <u>They shall make known unto you all things which are done here</u>." (Col. 4:7-9)

\*Onesimus (who is from Colossae) and Tychicus brought Paul's letter to the Colossians.

\*\*Tychicus and Onesimus will inform the Colossians concerning all the things Paul wants them to know.

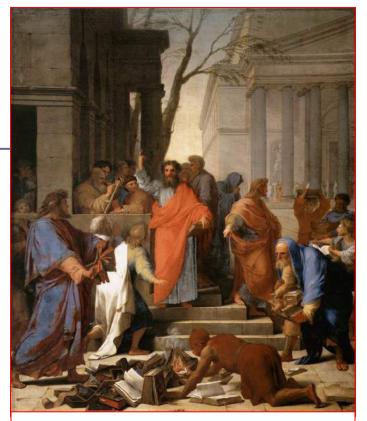

- \*Personal letters from Paul to Timothy/Titus (rather than to entire congregation).
- \*\*Nicknamed the "Pastoral Epistles."
- \*\*\*Written from one pastor/shepherd (=Paul) to another pastor/shepherd (=Timothy/Titus) about pastoring/shepherding
  - (=Christian leadership)
- 2 Timothy was written from prison, while the exact contexts behind
   1 Timothy and Titus are not known



"As I besought thee to abide still at Ephesus, when I went into Macedonia, that thou mightest charge some that they teach no other doctrine, ..."

### "Endless Genealogies"

Neither give heed to <u>fables</u> and <u>endless genealogies</u>, which minister questions, rather than godly edifying which is in faith: *so do*.

\*\*Genealogies of the lineage of Jesus

O Timothy, keep that which is committed to thy trust, avoiding profane and vain babblings, and oppositions of science falsely so called:

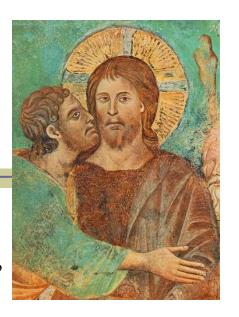

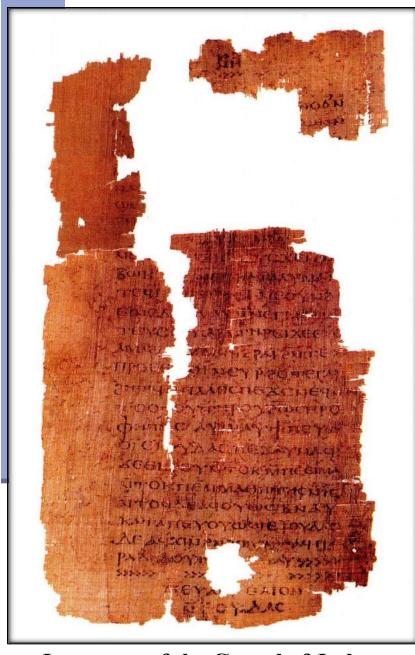

### "Gnosticism"

- Derived from the Greek word gnosis or "knowledge"
- It refers to "revealed knowledge" available only to those who have received the secret teachings of a heavenly revealer
- All other humans are trapped in ignorance, the true home of the Gnostic is to return to the divine world
- For Gnostics it was not the salvific act of the atonement that was most important but secret knowledge that Jesus imparted to his disciples that lead to salvation

### Qualifications for a Bishop

1 Timothy 3:1–7 (cf. D&C 107:68–88)

<sup>1</sup> This *is* a true saying, *If a man desire the office of a bishop*, *he desireth a good work*. <sup>2</sup> A bishop then must be blameless, the husband of one wife, vigilant, sober, of good behaviour, given to hospitality, apt to teach; <sup>3</sup> Not given to wine, no striker, not greedy of filthy lucre; but patient, not a brawler, not covetous; <sup>4</sup> One that ruleth well his own house, having his children in subjection with all gravity; <sup>5</sup> (For if a man know not how to rule his own house, how shall he take care of the church of God?) <sup>6</sup> Not a novice, lest being lifted up with pride he fall into the condemnation of the devil. <sup>7</sup> Moreover he must have a good report of them which are without; lest he fall into reproach and the snare of the devil.

- **"the husband of one wife" (v. 2)** 
  - This does no refer to Polygamy
  - Better translation "married once"
- "not a drunkard, not violent but gentle, not quarrelsome, and not a lover of money." 1 Tim. 3:3 NRS
- Maintains his household well, it is orderly (vv. 4–5)
  - Paul teaches an important eternal principal here (v. 5)
- "not a novice" (v.6)
  - Should not be a Neophyte (newly planted), i.e. a recent convert

### Qualifications for a Deacon

1 Timothy 3:8–13

<sup>8</sup> Likewise *must* the deacons *be* grave, not doubletongued, not given to much wine, not greedy of filthy lucre; <sup>9</sup> Holding the mystery of the faith in a pure conscience. <sup>10</sup> And let these also first be proved; then let them use the office of a deacon, being *found* blameless. <sup>11</sup> Even so *must their* wives *be* grave, not slanderers, sober, faithful in all things. <sup>12</sup> Let the deacons be the husbands of one wife, ruling their children and their own houses well. <sup>13</sup> For they that have used the office of a deacon well purchase to themselves a good degree, and great boldness in the faith which is in Christ Jesus.

- Deacons in the early church (and in the early LDS Church) were adult males, not 12–13 year-old boys.
- **"Deacon"** = servant (Greek: diakonos)
- "[Elders, priests, and teachers are] to be assisted always, in all duties in the church,
   by the deacons." (D&C 20:57)
- What does "Holding the mystery of the faith" refer to?
  - The mystery (in this case) = the incarnation, ministry, resurrection of Chris, who is God Himself.
  - Deacons (and all leaders & members) should have a testimony of the identity, life, and mission of Jesus Christ.

### The "Latter Times"

<sup>1</sup> Now the Spirit speaketh expressly, that in the **latter times** some shall depart from the faith, giving heed to seducing spirits, and doctrines of devils; <sup>2</sup> Speaking lies in hypocrisy; having their conscience seared with a hot iron; <sup>3</sup> **Forbidding to marry**, and commanding to abstain from meats, which God hath created to be received with thanksgiving of them which believe and know the truth.

#### 1 Timothy 4:1–3

- NT references to "latter times" ("last days") often refer to the <u>current</u> time period or immediate future, rather than only 2000 years later.
  - \*Paul and other early Christians felt they were living in the "latter times"
    - "[Christ] was foreordained before the foundation of the world, but was manifest in <u>these</u> <u>last times</u> for you." (1 Peter 1:20)
    - "God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spoke in time past unto the fathers by the prophets, has in **these last days** spoken unto us by his Son." (Hebrews 1:1)
- Gnostics forbade marriage since they eschewed sexual intercourse and also abstained from eating meats

# 1 Timothy 5 Widows in the Early Church

- \*Because of their undistracted devotion to God, they felt widows were blessed with superior spirituality (cf. 1 Tim. 5:5).
- \*With no husbands to support them, the church would often provide welfare assistance for widows.

\*But some women took advantage of the system and the

generosity of the saints.

"She that is a widow indeed, trusts in God, and continues in supplications and prayers night and day."

(1 Tim. 5:5)

"Let not a widow be taken into the number (1) under threescore years old, having been (2) the wife of one man. Well reported of for good works; if she have brought up children, if she have lodged strangers, if she have washed the saints' feet, if she have relieved the afflicted, if she have (3) diligently followed every good work." (1 Tim. 5:9-10)

#### "The number" =

list of widows who qualify for welfare support from the church

\*Qualifications for "the number" of widows:

- 1) At least 60 years old
- 2) Not unnecessarily divorced / remarried
- 3) Exemplary life of goodness / service

### **Titus**

- Titus is a Gentile convert brought to the Jerusalem Conference in A.D. 49 (Galatians 2:1–3)
- The Epistle is sent to Titus who is in Crete (1:5)
  - "I left you behind in **Crete** for this reason, so that you should put in order what remained to be done, and should appoint elders in every town, as I directed you:" (1:5)



- Is sent from Nicopolis
  - "When I send Artemas to you, or Tychicus, do your best to come to me at Nicopolis, for I have decided to spend the winter there." (3:12)
- Titus is so similar to 1 Timothy that much of 1 Timothy seems to be basically repeated in the letter.

### **Titus**

- Warnings about fables, genealogies... (Titus 1:14; 3:9)
  - A man that is an heretick after the first and second admonition reject; (Titus 3:10)
- Advice to bishops (Titus 1:6-9)
  - 12 One of themselves (Cretians), even a prophet of their own, said, The Cretians are alway liars, evil beasts, slow bellies.
     13 This witness is true. Wherefore rebuke them sharply, that they may be sound in the faith;

Titus 1:12-13

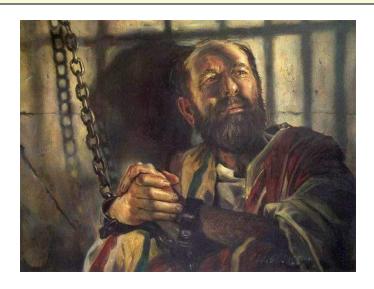

"I thank God, whom I serve from *my* forefathers with pure conscience, that without ceasing I have remembrance of thee in my prayers night and day; Greatly desiring to see thee, being mindful of thy tears, that I may be filled with joy; When I call to remembrance the unfeigned faith that is in thee, which dwelt first in thy grandmother **Lois**, and thy mother **Eunice**; and I am persuaded that in thee also . . ."

(1 **Tim 1:3-5**)

### Current and Coming Apostasy

#### 2 Timothy

- "This thou knowest, that all they which are in Asia be turned away from me; of whom are Phygellus and Hermogenes." (2 Tim. 1:15)
- "You know that everyone in the province of Asia has deserted me, including Phygelus and Hermogenes." (2 Tim. 1:15 NIV)
- <sup>16</sup> But shun profane *and* vain babblings: for they will increase unto more ungodliness. <sup>17</sup> And their word will eat as doth a canker: of whom is Hymenaeus and Philetus; <sup>18</sup> Who concerning the truth have erred, saying that the resurrection is past already; and overthrow the faith of some. (2:16–18)
- "This know also, that in the last days perilous times shall come. . . <u>Having a form</u> of godliness, but denying the power thereof: from such turn away." (3:1–5)

### Negative Examples

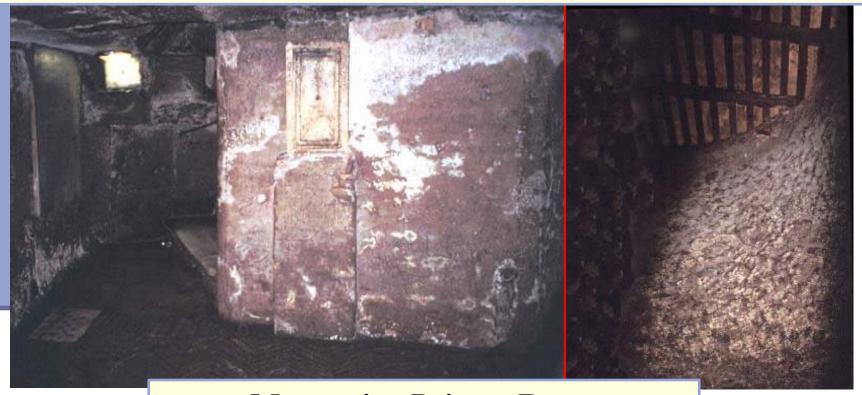

  - The scriptures at Paul and Timothy's time would have been, for the most part, the Jewish scriptures (our Old Testament)
  - "So that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work." (3:17 NIV, *artios* = KJV "perfect")

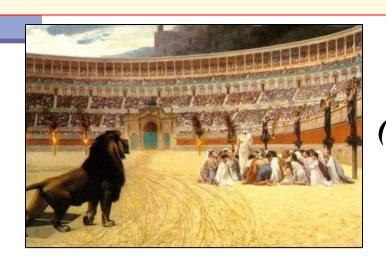

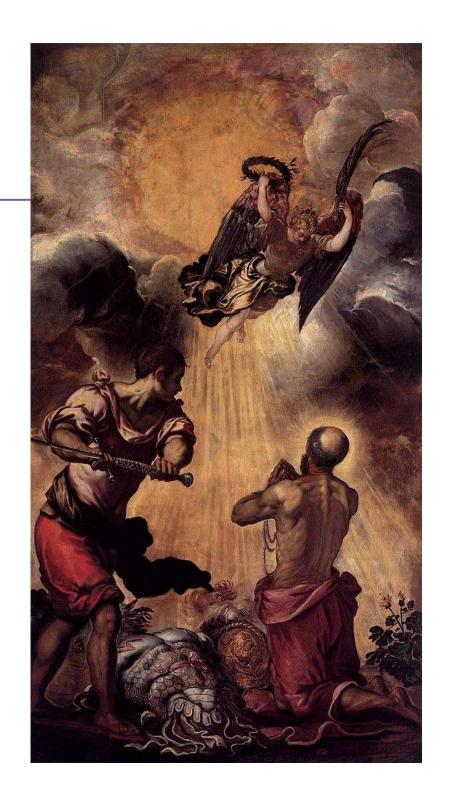
