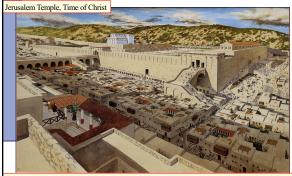

Epistle to the Hebrews

Authorship: Not identified in the text

- The attribution to Paul in the superscription (title) appears late
- Strictly speaking it is an anonymous letter
- "And the fourteen letters of Paul are obvious and plain, yet it is not right to ignore that some dispute the Epistle to the Hebrews, saying that it was rejected by the Church of Rome as not being by Paul, and I will expound at the proper time what was said about it by our predecessors."

As for the Epistle to the Hebrews, he [Clement] says indeed that it is Paul's, but that it was written for Hebrews in the Hebrew tongue, and that Luke, having carefully translated it, published it for the Greeks; hence, as a result of this translation, the same complexion of style is found in this Epistle and in the Acts: but that the [words] 'Paul an apostle' were naturally not prefixed. For, says he, 'in writing to Hebrews who had conceived a prejudice against him and were suspicious of him, he very wisely did not repel them at the

beginning by putting his name."

"There exists an **Epistle to** the Hebrews under the name of Barnabas — a man sufficiently accredited by God, as being one whom Paul has stationed next to himself."

Does the inspiration of Hebrews hinge only on Pauline authorship?

NO!

- Hebrews is inspired no matter if Paul or Barnabas or even Luke wrote it.
- Barnabas or Luke can be just as inspired as Paul.

*Something about suffering was essential for Jesus ["he that sanctifies"] and is essential for us ["they who are sanctified"]?

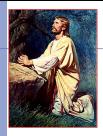

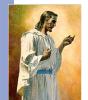

*The children of Israel were given the Gospel (at first), but it didn't help them.

*Why not?.

Because of unbelief

"[Moses] sought diligently to sanctify his people... but they hardened their hearts... Therefore, the Lord in his wrath, for his anger was kindled against them... took Moses out of their midst, and the Holy Priesthood also." (D&C 84:23-25)

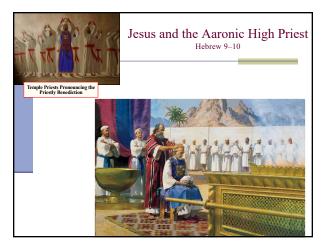

The High Priest

- He alone could enter the Holy of Holies (Lev. 16:3, 15, 33-34)
- He alone could make atonement for the people, the priests and own house (Lev 4:3ff; 9:8ff; 16:6)
- He alone officiated at the ceremony of the two goats (one was slain and the other was driven into the wilderness (Exo 30:10; Lev 16:8-10)

What are the Point of these verses?

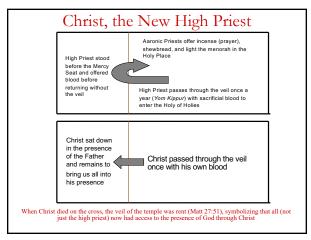
"But now once in the end of the world has [Christ] appeared to put away sin by the sacrifice of himself... So Christ was once offered to bear the sins of many... We are sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all...but this man [Jesus] after he had offered one sacrifice for sins forever, sat down on the right hand of God... For by one offering he has perfected forever them that are sanctified."

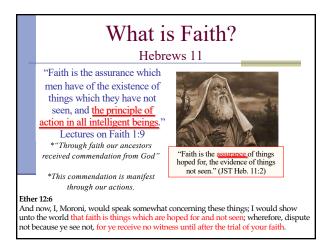
(Heb. 9:26,28; 10:10,12,14)

*Christ offered himself only once. and it worked permanently!

*Christ didn't need to repeat his sacrifice every year like Levitical high priests.

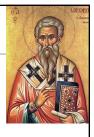

Which James?

James the Brother of John James the "Great" James the "Just" James the Brother of Jesus



Known as "the just" because of his apparent adherence to certain parts of the Jewish law

Known as the "Brother of Jesus" because he was the actual brother (half-brother) of Jesus (along with Jude)

Is not this the carpenter's son? is not his mother called Mary? and his brethren, *James*, and *Joses*, and *Simon*, and *Judas*? (Mat 13:55)



"His brethren therefore said unto him, Depart hence, and go into Judea, that thy disciples also may see the works that thou does... If thou do these things, show thyself to the world. For neither did his brethren believe in him.

(John 7:3-5)

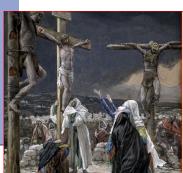
"brethren" = biological brothers (half-brothers) (not simply "disciples" or "brethren of the church")

"After this he went down to Capernaum, he, and his mother, and his brethren, and his disciples; and they continued there not many days." (John 2:12)

"A prophet is not without honor, but in his own country, and among his own kin [i.e. "family"], and in his own house." (Mark 6:4)

*James (and Jude) may have not believed Jesus at first.

Stoning of James

A.D. 62

When, therefore, Ananus was of this disposition, he thought he had now a proper opportunity to exercise his authority. Festus was now dead, and Albinus was but upon the road; so he assembled the Sanhedrin of judges, and brought before them the brother of Jesus, who was called Christ, whose name was James, and some others, and, when he had formed an accusation against them as breakers of the law, he delivered them to be stoned:

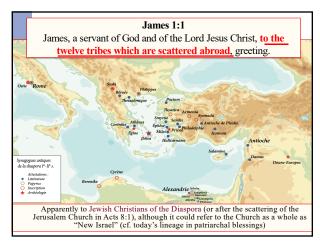

Genre and Focus of James

- Shaped in letter format only in its opening (1:1)
- Overall a Sermon
- Focuses on <u>practical religion</u>
 - Based also on the teachings of Jesus
 - Provides a witness to the teachings of the Sermon on the Mount independent of Matthew
 - Topics include testing, economic behavior, speech and interpersonal interactions, endurance, and encouragement

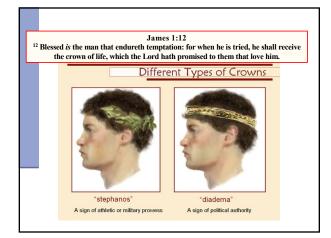

Pure Religion

James 1:27

<u>Pure religion</u> and undefiled before God and the Father is this, To <u>visit the fatherless and widows in their affliction</u>, <u>and</u> to keep himself unspotted from the world.

*"Religion" = worship (Greek: thrēskeia)

*"Religion" (or "worship") in its purest form is serving others who are in need.

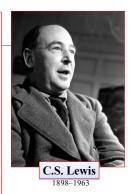

- James: By faith and works, because mere passive belief does not include works.

 - "Is not this the carpenter [Jesus], the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon, and are not his sisters here with us?" And they took offense at him." (Mark 6:3)
 - Jude never identifies himself as the brother of Jesus, but as the brother of James.
 - There were many Jameses. Which James? He doesn't say.

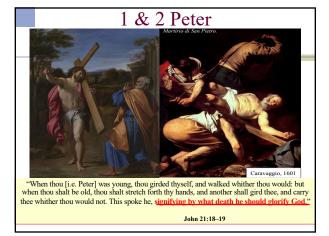

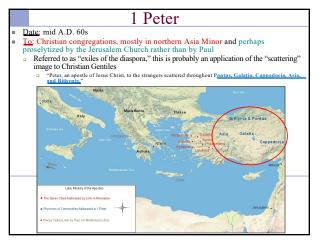

Therefore, to check this rumour Nero substituted as culprits and afflicted with the most exquisite tortures those who were called Christians by the nob and hated for their abominations. Christ, from whom the name originated, had been crucified by the procurator Pontius Pilate in the reign of Tiberius. Though checked for the time this deadly superstition again broke out, not only in Judea, where the evil originated, but even in the city, where all things attractions and shameful from every part of the world come together and flourish. Therefore, first those who confessed were arrested, then from their disclosures a great multitude was convicted, not so much for the crime of incendiarism, as for their hater for mankind. Mockery was added as they perished, for some, covered with the skins of wild beasts, were mangled by dogs, many were crucified or given to flames, still others were used as a nightly illumination after the daylight had futed. Nero had offered his gardens for this spectacle, and was giving games fit for the circus, where in the dress of a charioteer he mingled with the people or class stood on high in his chariot. Therefore, although they were guilty and deserved the most severe punishment, a feeling of pity arose, since they were being put to death not for public welfare but to satisfy the rage of one person.

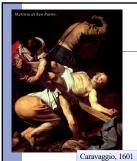

- Purpose: Additional exhortation and encouragement; stresses the scriptural and authoritative basis necessary to counter false teaching; teaches the reality of the Second Coming, even if it is delayed

- Probably written after the gospel to strengthen the faith of Christians who were being disturbed by false teachers
- □ Style and topics, however, connect it closely with the Gospel
 - *The language of 1-3 John is very similar to the Gospel of John (imagery using love-hate, light-darkness, truth-lies, flesh-spirit, etc.).

■ Written to:

- *"My Beloved Little Children" (cf. 1 John 2:1,12, 18, 28, etc.)
- *Probably means John's converts or his congregation (or if Peter is dead, then John could be addressing the church in general).
- *Normally grouped with the other "Catholic Epistles."
- *1-3 John are traditionally the last written material in the New Testament (even later than the Book of Revelation).

Docetism

- Docetism: the human existence of Jesus was not salvifically significant
 - Forerunners of the later "Gnostics" (those with special gnōsis or knowledge) who thought that secret doctrines ostensibly taught by Jesus were more important than what he did in dying as the Lamb of God
 - Later heretics claimed that the divine Jesus never even became flesh, he only "seemed" to live and die
- The Johannine Epistles (see 1 John 4:2–3) stress that not only was Jesus the Son of God, but that in his earthly career Jesus actually lived, had a body of flesh and blood and died as he did . . in other words, that he was the Lamb of God!

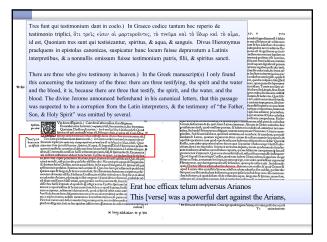

 - Seemingly Johannine Christians distant from the elder who are threatened by traveling teachers preaching schismatic doctrines, probably the same as those contested in 1 John

2 John contains the same themes as 1 John:

- *Members who do not love one another (2 John 1:5-6)
- *False teachers who teach Docetism, that Jesus did not come to earth in a physical body (2 John 1:7)
- *Concern with apostasy/rebellion from within (2 Jn 1:9-11)

Why is 2 John so short?

- *John says that he will visit them and tell them much more in person.
 - "Having many things to write unto you, I would not write with paper and ink. But I trust to come unto you, and speak face to face, that our joy may be full." (2 John 1:12)

■ The author only identifies himself as "the elder" (3 John 1:1).

To:

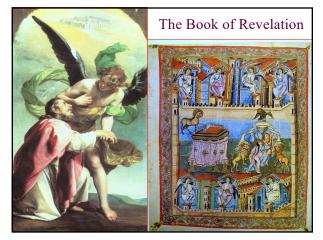

The Book of Revelation

- PLEASE NOTE: It is the "Book of Revelation" (Singular!), not the "Book of Revelations" (Plural)
- It is also known as the "Apocalypse of John"
 - Apocalypse" = "unveiling / disclosure" (i.e. Revelation)

- What is an Apocalypse?
 - Apocalypse: Disclosure of heavenly information that pertains to the things which must come to pass, usually before the END
 - Best example of an Apocalypse in Old Testament is the **Book of Daniel**
 - Disclosure is made primarily through imagery & symbolism
 - * White = Blood, death; Green = life, goodness; Black = evil, death
 - Eyes = Knowledge; Horn = Power; Wings = Ability to move & act
 - **4**, 7, 10, 12, 100, 1000 = perfection, completeness
 - Disclosure given in symbolism so only those in the "know" can fully understand
